

#### **Preface**

The *Statistical Handbook* is designed as a reference document with basic student, faculty, staff, degree, semester credit hour and financial information for the nine academic and six health-related institutions and The University of Texas System as a whole. Where available, data are reported for the most recent five years so that trends can be identified.

Data reported by the UT System institutions to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board have been used extensively in this publication. However, these data may vary somewhat from information presented and used internally by individual institutions due to differences in management information systems, data definitions, and intended application.

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#### **General Analysis - Students**

Total fall 2004 enrollment at U. T. System institutions is 182,752 students, an increase of 5,076 (or 2.9%) from fall 2003 and 30,555 (or 20.1%) from fall 2000. Enrollment at academic institutions increased by 2.6% and 20.3% and health institutions by 6.6% and 16.8%, respectively.

Demonstrating U. T. System's contribution to *Closing the Gaps*, undergraduate enrollment grew by almost 22,000 students or 19% since fall 2000. Graduate/professional enrollment increased by almost 8,700 students (24.9%) over the same time period. Further, in fall 2004 there were 22,267 first-time undergraduates and 13,828 undergraduate transfers attending U. T. System academic institutions. Enrollment for first-time undergraduates increased by 20.8% from fall 2000, while undergraduate transfers increased by 17.9%.

Overall, gender distributions at U. T. System remained fairly steady over the past five years, with male enrollment around 46% and female enrollment around 54%. However, there has been a steady increase in the percentage of women attending the health institutions, from 58% female in fall 2000 to 61.3% female in fall 2004.

Ethnic distributions at the institutions continue to change as the population of Texas becomes more diverse. System-wide, the percentage of white students decreased by 5%, from 47.1% in fall 2000 to 41.9% in fall 2004. At the academic institutions, the percentage of African American and Asian American students increased slightly, and the Hispanic population increased from 33.3% to 36.6% over four years. At the health institutions, the International population increased from 6% to 11.1% during that same period.

U. T. System institutions also serve diverse regions throughout Texas. The highest enrollments at academic institutions are from the regions that include the major population centers in the state - South Texas (37.2%), the Metroplex (23.2%), Upper Rio Grande (11.5%) and the Gulf Coast (11.3%). The highest percentage of students at the health institutions come from the Gulf Coast (44.9%) and South Texas (37%) regions.

Undergraduate transfers to our academic institutions are predominately female (56.2% in fall 2004), transferred from a Texas Junior College (61.7%), and are ethnically diverse. Almost 43% of transfers are white, 35.4% are Hispanic, 7.2% are African American and 6.1% are Asian American. The four-year graduation rate for undergraduate students who transfer to academic institutions with 30 or more semester credit hours from a community college ranges from almost 31% to 68% at our institutions.


Applications from first-time undergraduate students continue to rise at all of the academic institutions, increasing by almost 49% since fall 2000. The proportion of enrolled students who graduated in the top 10% of their class (Texas only) varies by institution and ranges from almost 8% to 62% this fall. These entering students are predominantly female (52.4%) and non-white, with Hispanics comprising 43.2% of the class, Asian Americans 9.8%, African Americans 4.9%, and International 3.1%.

A subset of first-time undergraduates is "first-time, full-time, degree-seeking undergraduates" who are tracked over time to measure student success. First-year persistence rates for first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students at academic institutions ranged from over 54% to over 91% for the fall 2002 cohort. Most institutions had first-year persistence rates of 66% (2 out of 3 students) or higher.


Six-year composite graduation and persistence rates, which track students graduating from or persisting at any Texas public institution, ranged from about 52% to 82% for the fall 1997 cohort. Only two academic institutions, however, had more than 50% of their students graduating from their own institution within six years.







#### **Health Institutions Fall Enrollment**




#### **Academic Institutions** Enrollment by Level, Fall 2004



**Health Institutions** Enrollment by Level, Fall 2004




#### U.T. System Fall Enrollment by Ethnicity, Fall 2004



### **General Analysis – Semester Credit Hours**


From fall 1999 to fall 2003, the U. T. System increased the number of semester credit hours taught at the academic institutions from 1.5 million to more than 1.8 million, a 23% increase. The number of undergraduate hours increased by 21.8%, from 1.3 million to nearly 1.6 million semester credit hours, while the number of semester credit hours for master's, doctoral and professional level instruction grew at an even faster rate. The number of semester credit hours taught at the master's level increased from 146,547 to 184,113 (25.6%), the number of doctoral hours increased from 35,480 to 53,372 (50.4%), and the number of professional credit hours increased from 21,180 to 27,742 (31.0%). Comparable information is not available for health institutions because detailed semester credit hour data are not collected by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

The ratio of full-time equivalent students to full-time equivalent faculty increased for almost every academic institution. In fall 2003, the ratio of students to faculty varied from 16 to 1 at U. T. Tyler to 26 to 1 at U. T. San Antonio. Most academic institutions fell in the range of 18 to 21 full-time equivalent students per full-time equivalent faculty.


The average number of semester credit hours (SCH) taken by undergraduate students at the academic institutions increased slightly from fall 2000 to fall 2004. In fall 2004, the average number of semester credit hours was 11.9 at the undergraduate level, 7.5 at the graduate level and 14.1 at the professional level. At the health institutions, the average load decreased slightly at the undergraduate level, from 12.4 in fall, 2000 to 11.7 in fall, 2004. System-wide, the average credit load has remained stable for graduate and professional students.


**Undergraduate Semester Credit Hours Academic Institutions** 




Masters, Doctoral and Professional Semester **Credit Hours Academic Institutions** 




**Average Student Credit Load by Level** Fall 2004 - Academic Institutions

### General Analysis - Faculty & Staff\*

The number of faculty employed by U.T. System institutions grew from 14,172 in fall 2001 to 15,814 in fall 2004, an 11.6% increase. At the academic institutions, the number of faculty increased from 7,811 to 8,752, a 12.0% increase, driven primarily by enrollment growth. At the health institutions, the number of faculty increased from 6,361 to 7,062, or 11.0%. The increase in health faculty was driven by an expansion of research and clinical care activities at these institutions.

Following the national trend, the proportion of faculty at our institutions in tenured/tenure-track positions (professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor) is declining over time, while the proportion of other professional faculty (visiting, adjunct, and clinical ranks as well as lecturers, specialists and some research faculty not on tenure track) is increasing.

Although the majority of faculty within the U.T. System are men, the overall proportion of women increased slightly between fall 2001 and fall 2004. However, the changes varied by tenure status. At the academic institutions, the proportion of tenured women faculty increased from 22.8% to 24.8%, tenure-track women decreased slightly from 39.5 to 38.5%, and other professional women faculty increased from 47.9% to 49.6%. At the health institutions, the proportion of tenured women faculty increased slightly from 22.3% to 22.7%, tenure-track women increased from 29.8% to 32.1%, and other professional women faculty increased from 41.9% to 43.1%.


The faculty employed at both the academic and health institutions was slightly more diverse in fall 2004 than fall 2001. Within the academic institutions, the proportion of white faculty declined from 74.9% in 2001 to 72.2% in 2004. The representation of all the non-white ethnic groups, except for Native Americans, increased during this same time period. The proportion of African American faculty increased from 2.5% to 2.7%, Hispanic faculty increased from 12.8% to 14.1% and Asian American faculty increased from 6.4% to 7.5%. International faculty increased from 2.9% to 3.1% and the percentage of Native American faculty remained stable. At the health institutions, the proportion of white faculty decreased from 73.1% in 2001 to 68.2% in 2004. The proportion of African American faculty declined slightly from 3.0% to 2.9%, while the Hispanic, Asian American and International faculty increased. Hispanic faculty increased from 6.2% to 7.1%, Asian American faculty from 16.2% to 18.3% and International faculty from 1.3% to 3.3%.

In fall 2004, there were 48,895 classified staff, 12,346 administrative and professional staff and 15,227 student employees working at U.T. System institutions.




### Faculty Headcount by Tenure Status Academic Institutions




### Faculty Headcounts by Tenure Status Health Institutions





Percent of Faculty Who are Tenured and Tenure-Track Women - Academic Institutions

#### **General Analysis - Degrees**

In 2003-04, U. T. System institutions awarded more than 35,000 degrees, a 19.2% increase over the 1999-00 academic year. System institutions produce over one-third of the baccalaureate degrees awarded and almost seven out of ten health care degrees awarded by public institutions in Texas.

The number of degrees awarded at the academic institutions increased from 26,802 in 1999-00 to 32,292 in 2003-04, a 20.5% increase. At the health institutions the number of degrees awarded increased from 2,712 to 2,891, a 6.6% increase over the same time period.


Overall, around 55.5% of degrees were awarded to women, a percentage that has remained fairly stable since 1999-00. However, in 2003-04, women earned 57.2% of baccalaureate degrees at the academic institutions and 75.4% of the certificate and baccalaureate degrees at the health institutions. At the graduate/professional level, women earned 49.6% of the degrees at academic institutions and 54.7% at health institutions.

System-wide, the proportion of degrees awarded to African American, Hispanic, Asian American and International students increased over time, while the proportion awarded to white students decreased. In 2003-04, over half of the degrees awarded were to non-white and International students (51.6%), with Hispanics receiving one-fourth of the total degrees awarded (25.1%). At the undergraduate level, non-white and International students earned 51.1% of the degrees at academic institutions and 45.3% of degrees and certificates at the health institutions. At the graduate/professional level, non-white and International students earned 55.6% of the degrees at academic institutions and 39.8% of degrees and certificates at health institutions.




Academic Institutions Degrees Awarded




Health Institutions Degrees Awarded




Academic Institutions
Degrees by Level, 2003-04




Health Institutions Degrees by Level, 2003-04

#### General Analysis - Finance

Major revenue sources for UT System institutions are contracts & grants, state appropriations, tuition & fees for the academic institutions, and sales and services of hospitals for the health institutions. However, the percent of total revenues from state appropriations continues to decline in relation to total revenues. In FY 2004, state appropriations accounted for less than 28% of the academic institutions' revenue and less than 17% of the health institutions' revenue. This is further demonstrated by the decrease over time in appropriated funds per full-time equivalent (FTE) students and FTE faculty at our academic institutions.

Also, as tuition and fee revenue increase, there is an increasing amount of student financial aid support awarded to students. In 2003-04, financial aid to undergraduates at our academic institutions exceeded \$737.5 million.

The three largest categories of expenses are hospitals and clinics, instruction, and research. Operating expenses for hospitals and clinics increased from 1.65 billion in 2000 to 2.04 billion in 2004, a 24% increase. Operating expenses for instruction increased from 1.47 billion in FY 2000 to 1.91 billion in FY 2004, a 30% increase.


Total research expenditures from all sources exceeded \$1.54 billion in FY 2004, and federal research expenditures increased by 55.8%, from over \$626 million in FY 2000 to almost \$976 million in FY 2004. Expenditures at academic institutions increased by 38.1% and at health institutions by 66% during that same time period.

The amount of money expended for administrative costs relative to total expenses declined for academic institutions. In FY 2000, administrative costs accounted for 8.3% of total expenses and in 2004 accounted for 7.6%. For the health institutions, the ratio of administrative costs to total expenses increased slightly from 6.4% in 2000 to 6.7% in 2004.




#### Academic Institutions Key Revenues, FY 2004




#### Academic Institutions Key Expenses, FY 2004



#### Health Institutions Key Revenues, FY 2004




#### Health Institutions Key Expenses, FY 2004


