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INTRODUCTION

1.1 Description of The University of Texas System

The University of Texas System has served Texas for more than 135 years, improving the lives of Texans—and people all over the world—through education, health care and research at 13 academic and health institutions across the state. With an enrollment of almost 243,000 students, the UT System is one of the nation's largest public university systems of higher education.

UT institutions are powerful drivers of economic and social mobility in Texas, producing more than 67,000 degrees annually, including more than one-third of the state's bachelor's degrees and more than half of the state's medical degrees. Almost half of all undergraduate degrees are awarded to students who qualify for a Pell grant based on financial need while enrolled at a UT institution. Sixty percent of undergraduates who received need-based financial aid double their parents' income within five years of earning a UT degree.

More than three-fourths of undergraduate students secure jobs in Texas within a year after graduation, providing a skilled workforce and fueling the state's economy. According to Georgetown University's Center on Education and the Workforce, a UT degree's return on investment is among the best in the nation.

The UT System also is one of the largest employers in the state with 22,000 faculty – including Nobel laureates and members of National Academies – and 93,000 health care professionals, researchers and staff.

Creating a healthier Texas is a fundamental mission of UT institutions, which award more than 15,000 health-related degrees annually. The UT System is poised to open its seventh medical school in Tyler in 2023. UT-owned and affiliated hospitals and clinics – supported by thousands of doctors, physician assistants, nurses and other health care providers – accounted for more than 10.6 million outpatient visits and over 2 million hospital days in 2021.

In addition to world-class patient care, UT researchers are on the front lines of advancing treatments and therapies for deadly and debilitating diseases. Life-changing and life-saving research and invention of new technologies regularly place UT institutions among the top 10 world's most innovative universities, according to Reuters and the National Academy of Inventors. Total research spending across the 13 UT institutions exceeds \$3.5 billion annually, the most in Texas, and the UT System is No. 1 in Texas and No. 2 in the nation in federal research expenditures among public higher education systems.

1.2 Background and Special Circumstances

University Lands (UL) manages the surface and mineral interests of 2.1 million acres of land across nineteen counties in West Texas for the benefit of the Permanent University Fund (PUF). The PUF is one of the largest university endowments in the United States and benefits more than twenty educational and health institutions across both the University of Texas System and Texas A&M.

As a result of years of oil and gas exploration on University Lands, there are abandoned caliche pits located in sixteen West Texas Counties. Some of the pits have no future benefit and need to be closed and the process primarily involves re-contouring the shoulders and reseeding the reclaimed pit. However, the nature of this work may also require a wide variety of miscellaneous tasks such as:

- Installing or repairing fences, gates, and signage
- Cattle guard installation, repair, cleanout, or removal
- Tire and trash removal from the caliche pit
- · Ancillary dirt and reclamation work
- Brush clearing
- Pad construction
- Road reclamation requiring caliche removal or relocation, soil ripping and reseeding

University Lands seeks the service of one or more heavy equipment contractors, with the ability to service the Permian Basin, who can provide these services on an as needed and best value basis. The anticipated contract term for these services is anticipated to be five years or more.

1.3 Objective of Request for Proposal

The University of Texas System is soliciting proposals from qualified vendors to perform earth moving and caliche pit services (**Work**) more specifically described in **Section 5.4** (Scope of Work) of this Request for Proposal (**RFP**).

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1.4 Group Purchase Authority

Texas law authorizes institutions of higher education (defined by §61.003, Education Code) to use the group purchasing procurement method (ref. §§51.9335, 73.115, and 74.008, Education Code). Additional Texas institutions of higher education may therefore elect to enter into a contract with the successful Proposer under this RFP. In particular, Proposer should note that University is part of The University of Texas System (UT System), which is comprised of thirteen institutions described at http://www.utsystem.edu/institutions. UT System institutions routinely evaluate whether a contract resulting from a procurement conducted by one of the institutions might be suitable for use by another, and if so, this RFP could give rise to additional purchase volumes. As a result, in submitting its proposal, Proposer should consider proposing a pricing model and other commercial terms that take into account the higher volumes and other expanded opportunities that could result from the eventual inclusion of other institutions in the purchase contemplated by this RFP. Any purchases made by other institutions based on this RFP will be the sole responsibility of those institutions.

2.1 Submittal Deadline

University will accept proposals submitted in response to this RFP until 2:30 p.m., Central Standard Time ("CST") on Tuesday, November 22, 2022 (the "Submittal Deadline").

2.3 Criteria for Selection

The successful Proposer(s), if any, selected by University through this RFP will be the Proposer(s) that submits a proposal on or before the Submittal Deadline, meets our standards and is the most advantageous to University. The successful Proposer(s) is referred to as "Contractor."

Proposer is encouraged to propose terms and conditions offering the maximum benefit to University in terms of (1) service, (2) total overall cost, and (3) project management expertise.

The evaluation of proposals and the selection of Contractor will be based on the information provided in the proposal. University may consider additional information if University determines the information is relevant. University anticipates selecting multiple Contractors who will be invited to reply to "work packages".

2.5 Historically Underutilized Businesses

- All agencies of the State of Texas are required to make a good faith effort to utilize historically underutilized businesses (each a HUB) in contracts. The goal of the HUB program is to promote full and equal business opportunity for all businesses in contracting with state agencies and state universities. Pursuant to the HUB program, if a Contractor plans to subcontract any of the Services under the terms of any agreement or contractual arrangement resulting from this RFP, then the Contractor must make a good faith effort to utilize HUBs certified by the State of Texas. Proposals that fail to comply with the requirements contained in the HUB Subcontracting Plan (HSP) referred to in section 2.5.3 will constitute a material failure to comply with advertised specifications and will be rejected by University as non-responsive. Additionally, compliance with good faith effort quidelines is a condition precedent to awarding any agreement or contractual arrangement resulting from this RFP. To complete the work described below, University Lands seeks to identify multiple qualified vendors who can perform these services. The vendors identified and approved through this request for proposal process will be notified by University Lands of each "work package" via the project addendum. The locations will vary since the pits are located in sixteen West Texas Counties. Identified vendors, who are able to service all or some of the counties identified, will be asked to reply to the "work package" and will be chosen on a best value basis.

Contractor will provide the following services related to caliche pits located on University Lands in sixteen West Texas Counties, including Andrews, Crane, Crockett, Dawson, Ector, Gaines, Irion, Loving, Martin, Pecos, Reagan, Schleicher, Terrell, Upton, Ward and Winkler Counties.

All Addenda issued by University prior to the Submittal Deadline will be and are hereby incorporated as a part of this RFP for all purposes.

Proposers are required to acknowledge receipt of each Addendum as specified in this Section. The Proposer must acknowledge all Addenda by completing, signing and returning the <u>Addenda Checklist</u> (ref. **Section 4** of **APPENDIX ONE**). The Addenda Checklist must be received by University prior to the Submittal Deadline and should accompany the Proposer's proposal.

Any interested party that receives this RFP by means other than directly from University is responsible for notifying University that it has received an RFP package, and should provide its name, address, telephone and facsimile (**FAX**) numbers, and email address, to University, so that if University issues Addenda to this RFP or provides written answers to questions, that information can be provided to that party.

1.3 Public Information

Proposer is hereby notified that University strictly adheres to all statutes, court decisions and the opinions of the Texas Attorney General with respect to disclosure of public information.

University may seek to protect from disclosure all information submitted in response to this RFP until such time as a final agreement is executed.

Upon execution of a final agreement, University will consider all information, documentation, and other materials requested to be submitted in response to this RFP, to be of a non-confidential and non-proprietary nature and, therefore, subject to public disclosure under the *Texas Public Information Act* (ref. <u>Chapter 552</u>, <u>Government Code</u>). Proposer will be advised of a request for public information that implicates their materials and will have the opportunity to raise any objections to disclosure to the Texas Attorney General. Certain information may be protected from release under §§552.101, 552.104, 552.110, 552.113, and 552.131, Government Code.

1.4 Type of Agreement

Contractor, if any, will be required to enter into a contract with University in a form substantially similar to the Agreement between University and Contractor (the "Agreement") attached to this RFP as APPENDIX TWO, incorporated for all purposes and otherwise acceptable to University in all respects.

1.5 Proposal Evaluation Process

University will select Contractor by using the competitive sealed proposal process described in this Section. Any proposals that are not submitted by the Submittal Deadline or that are not accompanied by required number of completed and signed originals of the HSP will be rejected by University as non-responsive due to material failure to comply with this RFP (ref. **Section 2.5.4** of this RFP). Upon completion of the initial review and evaluation of proposals, University may invite one or more selected Proposers to participate in oral presentations. University will use commercially reasonable efforts to avoid public disclosure of the contents of a proposal prior to selection of Contractor.

University may make the selection of Contractor on the basis of the proposals initially submitted, without discussion, clarification or modification. In the alternative, University may make the selection of Contractor on the basis of negotiation with any of the Proposers. In conducting negotiations, University will use commercially reasonable efforts to avoid disclosing the contents of competing proposals.

University may discuss and negotiate all elements of proposals submitted by Proposers within a specified competitive range. For purposes of negotiation, University may establish, after an initial review of the proposals, a competitive range of acceptable or potentially acceptable proposals composed of the highest rated proposal(s). In that event, University may defer further action on proposals not included within the competitive range pending the selection of Contractor; <u>provided</u>, <u>however</u>, University reserves the right to include additional proposals in the competitive range if deemed to be in the best interest of University.

After the Submittal Deadline but before final selection of Contractor, University may permit Proposer to revise its proposal in order to obtain the Proposer's best and final offer.
