**Joint Admission Medical Program (JAMP)
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Background

The Joint Admission Medical Program (JAMP) was established in May 2001 through Senate Bill 940 by the 77th Texas Legislature. Its core mission is to provide financial support and comprehensive services to highly qualified, economically disadvantaged students, encouraging and enabling them to pursue a medical education.

At the University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB Health), the John Sealy School of Medicine Office of Student Affairs and Admissions (JSSOM) administers the JAMP program and ensures that all funding is expended in accordance with the JAMP Expenditure Guidelines. The organizational chart below identifies the key individuals responsible for JAMP’s program oversight and financial management.



Objective, Scope and Methodology

The audit was conducted to evaluate UTMB Health’s compliance with JAMP requirements and JAMP Expenditure Guidelines for Fiscal Years 2024 and 2025. The audit was performed in accordance with the procedures provided by JAMP.

Executive Summary & Detailed Results

The audit encompassed financial activities reported for both Fiscal Year 2024 and Fiscal Year 2025. Based on the procedures performed, this audit resulted in no findings of non-compliance with either the JAMP Agreement or the JAMP Expenditure Guidelines.
