I. Central Administration
A. Approval of Minutes, March $14-15$ and April 9, 1958. -Upon motion of Mr. $\qquad$ , seconded by Mr. $\qquad$ , the Board approved the Minutes of the meetings held March 14-15 and April 9, 1958 in the form as distributed by the Secretary to each member of the Board.
B. Report of Committee of the Whole: James A. Hamilton Associates.--Chairman Jeffers reported for the Committee of the Whole that subsequent to the meeting of the Board of Regents March 15, 1958, Mr. James A. Hamilton of James A. Hamilton Associates, Hospital Consultants, had appeared briefly before the Committee of the Whole. The Committee of the Whole insisted that the report including recommendations of James A. Hamilton and Associates be completed not later than the meeting of the Board of Regents May $30-31$, 1958. This report is in compliance with the contract adopted June 28, 1957 (Permanent Minutes Volume IV, Page 985 , with James A. Hamilton Associates for consultation services in connection with repair and rehabilitation projects at The University of Texas Medical Branch and for the development of a master plan for the Medical Branch.
C. Continuing Joint Committee of the Board of Regents and the University Development Board: Ratification of Cre ation and of Membership. --Chairman Jeffers reported to the Board that at a joint meeting of the Board of Regents and the University Development Board on Wednesday, April 9, it was agreed that a Continuing Joint Committee of the Board of Regents and the University Development Board be created to explore in detail the program of the University Development Board and the needs of the University that the Development Board can best serve. .
with a view to true excellence and distinction for the University. This Committee to be composed of two members of the Development Board and two members of the Board of Regents appointed by the Chairmen of the respective Boards would meet with the Executive Director of the Office of the University Development Board and with administrative officers designated by the President.

Since a majority of each Board was present at the joint meeting, Chairman Jeffers thereafter appointed Mr. J. P. Bryan and Mr. Joe C. Thompson as two members from the Board of Regents to serve on the Continuing Joint Committee.

Mr. $\qquad$ moved that the action of the Chairman in establishing the Continuing Joint Committee and in naming the two members from the Board of Regents be ratified by the Board. This motion seconded by Mr. $\qquad$ carried.
