AMENDMENT TO FACULTY AND STAFF INSURANCE CONTRACTS

1. It is recommended that the following University of Texas System contracts with Aetna Life and Casualty Company be amended effective September 1, 1972, to <u>clarify</u> the eligibility requirements:

Term Life No. C-2302 Cash Value Life No. T-47946 Long Term Disability No. 314 351-973 Accidental Death and Dismemberment No. 314 351

At present the eligibility wording is not consistent in the four contracts, and has caused some difficulty in interpretation. The new wording is consistent and clear, and does not appreciably change the present application of eligibility requirements in any of the four contracts. Each contract will provide eligibility to "employees who are employed at least one-half time or more" subject to additional requirements such as age and other limits present in each contract.

REGIONAL MEDICAL PROGRAM OF TEXAS

The System Administration docket (pages C-9 through C-16) for the Board of Regents' meeting on September 11, 1972 included, for Board approval, the budget and allocation of the \$2,106,720 grant award received under Renewal Grant No. 5-G03-RM 00007-04. Of this total grant amount, \$516,720 was an additional allocation to extend the grant to December 31, 1972.

Included in the total budget presented above was \$180,000 for further allocation to operational contracts for Health Manpower Needs and Resources, and \$87,337 unallocated developmental funds. As the grant year progressed, it became evident that approximately \$81,000 in additional funds would be available through reallocation from other projects. Since there was no provision for unexpended funds from the 1971-1972 fiscal year to be carried forward to the 1973 grant award under the new grantee, it was necessary to commit and encumber these funds by contract prior to December 31, 1972 or let them lapse and return to the federal government. Accordingly, the nine contracts described below have been developed to effectively utilize these funds and contracts have been executed on behalf of the Regional Medical Program of Texas for payment from Grant No. 5-G03-RM 00007-04. Since these contracts encumber funds available during the 1971-1972 fiscal year, the University of Texas System will continue to be responsible for the disbursement of these funds during the effective dates of the several contracts.

FACULTY LEGISLATION. The following legislation has been passed by the University Council and/or General Faculty. I recommend approval.

The University Council adopted by the circularization procedure the following changes in the College of Humanities Catalogue (D&P 5289-5290).

1. PROPOSAL TO CHANGE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A MAJOR IN FRENCH AND A MAJOR IN ITALIAN UNDER THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ARTS, PLAN I

In the statement of requirements for a major in French and a major in Italian appearing in the <u>College of Humanities</u> catalogue (pages 20 and 21), it is recommended that the requirement of a minor be deleted. The requirements for the minor currently read as follows:

FRENCH:

(1) Nine semester hours of courses in a second foreign language for which Course 407 (or 604) or 312L (or 612) is a prerequisite; or (2) twelve semester hours, including six upper-division hours, in any subject offered in arts and sciences or in the College of Fine Arts (see p. 19). With the approval of the adviser, appropriate University

courses may be counted toward this requirement. Closely related fields include classical civilization, English, history, linguistics, and philosophy.

ITALIAN:

(1) Nine semester hours of courses in a second foreign language above Course 407 (or 604), or (2) twelve semester hours, including six upper-division hours, in any subject offered in arts and sciences or in the College of Fine Arts (see p.19). With the approval of the adviser, appropriate University courses may be counted toward this requirement. Closely related fields include classical civilization, English, history, linguistics, and philosophy.

Reason: Policy in the College of Humanities no longer requires a minor, and the Department concurs in the belief that the minor does not serve a useful purpose. This deletion would bring our requirement into line with those in Classics, English, German, Philosophy and Slavic Languages.

2. PROPOSAL TO CHANGE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A MAJOR IN ITALIAN UNDER THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ARTS, PLAN I

It is recommended that the statement of requirements for a major in Italian appearing in the <u>College of Humanities</u> catalogue (pages 20-21) be changed as follows:

From:

Italian 604 (or 406,407), 312K and 312L (or 612); and at least fifteen semester hours of upper-division courses in Italian. Only such portion of the lower-division courses need be taken as may be required by the score on the language classification test.

To:

24 hours of Italian beyond the freshman level, 18 of which must be upper-division. Only such portion of the lower-division courses need be taken as may be required by the score on the language classification test.

<u>Reason</u>: To upgrade the Italian major and bring it more closely in line with other foreign language majors.

3. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO APPROVE 1972-73 DEGREE CANDIDATES

The University Council voted (D&P 5235) to delegate to the respective deans the authority of the faculty to approve degree candidates for the year September 1, 1972 to August 31, 1973.

4. PROPOSED CHANGE IN THE CATALOGUE REQUIREMENTS OF THE COLLEGES OF HUMANITIES, NATURAL SCIENCES, SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES, AND THE DIVISION OF GENERAL AND COMPARATIVE STUDIES FOR THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ARTS, PLAN I

The University Council adopted by the circularization procedure the proposed changes in the catalogue requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I contained in D&P 5263.

Present Catalogue Statement:

At least twelve hours, including six upper-division hours, must be taken in courses outside the broad area of the student's major (science, social science, language, humanities).

Proposed change:

That the present catalogue statement be deleted.

Reason:

The four area requirements which became effective in the 1968 revision for the B. A. degree, Plan I, made the original regulation unnecessary.





ADDITIONS TO BULLETIN

I recommend the addition of the following to the Bulletin of the University of Texas of the Permian Basin which was approved by the Board of Regents at its September 11, 1972 meeting:

FEES AND DEPOSITS

Students are not entitled to enter class or laboratory until their fees and deposits have been paid. Payment may be made by personal check for the exact amount due, provided the bank transit number is encoded thereon in compliance with revised Federal Reserve Bank regulations. Checks for larger amounts, the difference to be paid in cash to the student, cannot be handled. In paying fees by check, students are warned to exercise care. A bad check, whether given by mistake or otherwise, unless the admitted error of the bank concerned, is likely to delay actual payment and thus result in a penalty for late registration. (All of the fees listed are subject to change by the Legislature without notice.) See page 2 for tuition table.

Refund of Tuition Fee for Students Withdrawing

Upon presentation to the Registrar of his receipt from the Bursar showing payment of the fee, any student withdrawing officially (a) during the first week of classwork of a semester will receive a refund of seventy per cent of the applicable portion of the fee; (b) during the second week, sixty per cent; (c) during the third week, forty per cent; (d) during the fourth week, twenty per cent; (e) during the fifth week and thereafter, nothing.

An immediate refund will not be made to a student who withdraws within fifteen days after payment of his fees; but, upon request, a check covering all refunds will be mailed to the address left with the Registrar.

A student who enters the spring semester not knowing his fall-semester grades and who is required to withdraw because of failure in the work of the fall semester will have all of his registration and tuition fee for the spring semester refunded.

No refund provided for above will be granted unless applied for within one year after official withdrawal.

General Property Deposit

Every student unless he is registered in absentia must make a general property deposit of \$10 to protect the University from any loss whatsoever, such as property loss or damages or breakage or violation of rules in any University library or laboratory, failure to return keys furnished by the University, or for damage to or loss of any other University property.

This deposit, less outstanding charges, will be returned to the student, upon his request, at the end of his career here as a student. A general property deposit which remains without call for refund for a period of four years from the date of last attendance at The University of Texas of the Permian Basin shall be forfeited, and the deposit shall become operative to the permanent use and purpose of the Student Property

Deposit Scholarships. This applies to deposits made in the past, as well as those to be made in the future.

Student Services Fee

The student services fee is compulsory to both full-time and part-time students. The student services fee of \$30 for full-time students (12 hours or more) consists of free or reduced admission rates to athletic events, formal convocation events, health services, special publications, intramural activities, most athletic facilities, student identification card, free or reduced admission fees to lecture series, cultural events, and film series.

A \$10 fee is charged to part-time students taking less than 12 hours and entitles such students to publications, formal convocations, student identification card, health services, participation in intramurals and use of most athletic facilities.

A student spouse may purchase an activities card for \$10 which will entitle them to free or reduced admission to lecture series, cultural event programs and film series.

Refund of the student services fee for students withdrawing is made on the same basis as refund of the registration and tuition fee for students withdrawing.

Laboratory fees

For each laboratory course a fee is charged in an amount to cover in general the cost of laboratory materials and supplies used by a student; however, such charge per student shall be not less than two dollars (\$2) nor more than eight dollars (\$8) for each laboratory course in any one semester or summer term. The Course Schedule will indicate the amount of the laboratory fee for each course.

Supplementary Fees for Selected Courses

Students taking selected courses (e.g., studio art, art education, courses requiring field trips, lifetime sports, physical education, or applied music) are required to pay supplementary fees each semester, a schedule of which is given in the catalogue. A supplementary fee for applied music "unclassified" and art "unclassified" is charged.

Supplementary fees, in the case of students withdrawing or dropping a course, are refunded according to the schedule provided for refunding the registration and tuition fee. Exception: A student who officially drops a course with a supplementary fee and at the same time officially adds another such course will receive a refund of the full supplementary fee paid on the course dropped and will pay the corresponding fee required for the course added.

Special Charge for Late Registration

Any student registering who, with proper permission, registers after the appointed days for registering in that semester, will be required to pay a special charge of five dollars (\$5) to defray the costs of the extra services required to effect his late registration.

Bad Checks

A service charge of \$2 will be assessed the maker of the check for each returned check, to offset the cost of processing such checks.

Diploma Charge

A diploma fee of \$4 is charged to graduating students at the time of their graduation.

Non-Student Fees

Non-student gymnasium and physical activity fees for non-students desiring the use of the facilities of the gymnasium and other physical activity facilities (including the faculty-staff recreation program) will pay the following fees: Non-student--\$24 is to include dressing facility. Faculty and administrative staff (rank of instructor or above)--\$6 a year to include dressing facility. Special non-student group programs--\$1 a month or any portion thereof, not to include dressing facility.

Visitor's Fee

A fee of \$5 a semester or term is required of persons not registered in the University who wish to visit one or more courses. If library privileges are desired, the non-student library deposit of \$15 a year must be made.

Transcript Charge

A \$1 charge may be made for transcripts.

Student Identification Card Replacement Fee

All students who must obtain a replacement student identification card will be charged \$3.


