Texas Western College The September docket carried the appointment of Dr. Joseph R. Smiley as President at a twelve month rate of \$17,400, plus house and utilities, of which \$4,800 was to come from Cotton Estate funds. I recommend that Dr. Smiley also have the title of "Professor of Modern Languages," and further that \$1,200 of the Cotton Estate funds be in the form of an annuity paid by the University each year directly to the Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association.

1958-59 BUDGET FOR DEBT SERVICE REQUIREMENTS ON PERMANENT UNIVERSITY FUND BONDS: On recommendation of Mr. William W. Stewart, Endowment Officer, approved by Dr. J. C. Dolley, Vice-President for Fiscal Affairs, I recommend that the following budget for 1958-59 for Debt Service BONDS : Requirements on Permanent University Fund Bonds be adopted in lieu of the one printed in the Budget, the revision necessary because the refunding of the Permanent University Fund Bonds, Series 1949, has been done since the adoption of the 1953-59 Budget: (2655)

This compares with \$694,485 in the original budget, and assumes that the agency fees on the escrow deposit will be 1/4 of 1% of interest due and 1/8 of 1% of principal due, although no final arrangement has been made. This rate has also been used in figuring the payment on the premium.

RECOMMEND REAPPROPRIATIONS AND LAPSES OF PLANT FUNDS UNEXPENDED BALANCES $(l_{-2}/AT AUGUST 31, 1958; Mr. C. H. Sparenberg, Comptroller, has submitted a schedule of reappropriations and laspes of plant funds unexpended balances as at August 31, 1958, for the following:$

Available University Appropriation for Central Administration, Main University, and Medical Branch

Plant Funds Unexpended for Central Administration, Medical Branch, and Main University

The proper pages from the Monthly Financial Report are attached hereto as Appendix A, and I recommend approval of the indicated lapses and reappropriations as shown thereon. Quoted below is an excerpt from Mr. Sparenberg's letter in regard to these matters:

"I recommend that all the free balances marked 'R' be reappropriated and that all the free balances marked 'L' be lapsed. All the items marked 'L' under Available University Fund appropriations should be lapsed to the Available University Fund Unappropriated Balance except Accounts Nos. 91502, 91506, 91514, and 91525, which should be lapsed to Account No. 91500 - Major Repairs and Rehabilitation Projects. Under Plant Funds Unexpended for Main University, the balances marked 'L' in the various accounts should be lapsed as follows: Accounts Nos. 94021 and 94025 to Available University Fund Unappropriated Balance, Accounts Nos. 94040 and 94041 to Unappropriated Balance of General Funds of the Main University, and Accounts Nos. 94171, 94172, 94173, 94174, and 94175 to Account No. 94170 - Housing and Home Finance Agency Project No. Tex. 41-CH-26 -Kinsolving Dormitory - Allotment Account.

"Under Plant Funds Unexpended for Southwestern Medical School, the balances marked 'L' in the accounts under Clinical Science Building should all be lapsed to the Allotment Account for the Clinical Science Building, and the balances marked 'L' in the various accounts for the Service Building should all be lapsed to Plant Funds Unexpended - Unappropriated Balance. Under Plant Funds Unexpended for Texas Western College, the balance marked 'L' in the account for Excavation and Hauling - Borsberry Construction Company Inc., should be lapsed to the Allotment Account for Addition and Alterations to Student Union Building, and the balance marked 'L' in the account for Industrial Woodwork Company should be lapsed to the account for Movable Furniture and Equipment for Student Union Building.

ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION FOR CONSULTING ARCHITECT'S OFFICE AND TRAVELING EXPENSE ACCOUNT: The account for Consulting Architect - Mark Lemmon -Office and Traveling Expenses is virtually exhausted, and since Mr. Lemmon is still acting in the capacity of Consulting Architect for the Addition to the Physics Building and will need to make periodic inspection trips in connection therewith, I concur in Mr. Sparenberg's recommendation that \$150 be appropriated to the above account from the Unappropriated Balance of the Available University Fund. (2644)

CHANGE ORDER TO CONTRACT WITH FINGER CONTRACT SUPPLY COMPANY: In the appropriation for Equipment Group II and -III in connection with the Additions and Alterations to the M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute there is at present a balance of \$1,313.24 which was left at the time a contract was awarded to Finger Contract Supply Company for Furniture and Furnishing for this project. A change order which has the approval of Dr. R. Lee Clark, has been prepared for additional items of furniture not included in the original contract, adding \$1,312.10 to the contract price, and has been signed by Mr. C. H. Sparenberg, Comptroller, funds to come from the Equipment Group II and III. I recommend approval and ratification. (2643)

OUT-OF-STATE TRIPS: I recommend approval of the following out-of-state trips, with expenses as indicated:

1. Dr. Logan Wilson, President, October 7-10, 1958, to Chicago, Illinois, to attend a meeting of the Problems and Policies Committee of the American Council on Education and the annual meeting of the Council, expenses to be paid from travel funds of the President's Office.

2. Mr. Lanier Cox, Vice-President for Administrative Services, October 7-10, 1958, to Chicago, Illinois, to attend the meeting of the American Council on Education, expenses to be paid from travel funds of the Office of the President.

3. Mr. Hulon W. Black, Director, University Development Board, October 2 and 3, 1958, to St. Louis, Missouri, for conferences regarding problems relating to the Development Board's over-all program and procedures, expenses to be paid from travel funds of the Development Board and possibly from Supplemental Travel Expenses and Entertainment Fund.




