#### Gentlemen:

The budgetary dockets prepared by the component institutions listed below are herewith submitted, with my recommendation for approval, for consideration at the meeting of the Board of Regents on November 30 - December 1, 1962.

Main University Texas Western College Medical Branch Dental Branch M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute Southwestern Medical School Postgraduate School of Medicine

The following changes affecting Central Administration budgetary operations are recommended for approval by the Board of Regents:

#### RECOMMENDED AMENDMENTS TO THE 1962-63 BUDGET

#### Office of the Chancellor

1. In the 1962-63 Operating Budget, as in past years, the salaries for the three Vice-Chancellors have been split between administration and teaching, with the teaching portion prorated on the basis of an academic rate. Inasmuch as the total salary is set by the Board, the procedure has been to charge the difference to administration, such amount not necessarily being an "administrative rate."

The budget allocation indicated above resulted in utilization of a lesser amount of general revenue for administration than that lined in the appropriation bill, with an intended lapse to General Revenue of the difference. The State Comproller's interpretation of the bill disallowed paying the budgeted amounts for teaching. In order to pay the total approved salary from general funds, it is necessary to depart from the budgeted administrative salary and utilize completely the line-itemed amounts appropriated in the bill.

The Change in source of funds will not change the total compensation paid the individuals involved. The following transfers are required: (RBC 39)

Mr. Pope is employed in the System Personnel Office as Supervisor of Workmen's Compensation Insurance. (RBC 30)

4. Transfer from the Available University Fund Balance (Account No. \$12,500 to Central Administration Unallocated Account (Account No. (RBC 42)

REPORT ON PERMANENT UNIVERSITY FUND INVESTMENTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED AUGUST 31, 1962.—Under separate bound cover, the Land and Investment Committee presents a report on Permanent University Fund investments for the fiscal year ended August 31, 1962. During the year, the Committee made periodic reports of purchases, sales, calls, and exchanges made for the Fund, all of which transactions were duly approved by the Board of Regents. The present report summarizes the investment transactions for the fiscal year and indicates the status of the Fund's portfolio as of August 31, 1962.

LEASES AND EASEMENTS.—The Land and Investment Committee has given consideration to the following applications for various leases and easements on University Lands. All are at the standard rates, unless otherwise stated, are on the University's standard forms, with grazing leases carrying provisions for renewal for an additional five years at negotiated terms. Payments for easements and material source permits have been received in advance. All have been approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer. Approval of the applications and execution of the instruments involved by the Chairman of the Board or the Endowment Officer is recommended.

#### PERMANENT UNIVERSITY FUND - LAND MATTERS. --

NEWELL B. HAYES, E. E. TOWNSEND AND W. P. WALLACE, JR., PERMIT TO HUNT FOR BURIED TREASURE, BLOCKS 3 AND 4, UPTON COUNTY.--Mr. W. P. Wallace, Jr., an attorney of Del Rio, has proposed that the Board of Regents grant to him and his partners, Mr. Newell B. Hayes and Mr. E. E. Townsend, a permit to hunt for buried treasure on Blocks 3 and 4, University Lands, Upton County. (This is the same area which was covered by a recent permit to Mr. M. H. Chennault, Sr., whose search was unsuccessful.) They will pay a fee of \$200 for the permit to compensate for administrative handling by the University. The University will receive 50% of anything of value that is found. It is proposed that the permit allow them 90 days from January 1, 1963, to complete their work. Actual searching time will be limited to 10 days with appropriate allowance for recovery and removal if anything is found. The permittees will be responsible for any damage to the land and to the grazing tenant and will restore the ground in satisfactory condition.

It is recommended that the Board of Regents grant this permit and authorize its Chairman to execute the appropriate instrument when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

SURFACE LEASE NO. 1689 - THE WESTERN COMPANY OF NORTH AMERICA (WESTCO RESEARCH DIVISION), SECTION 11, BLOCK 6, ANDREWS COUNTY .-- Westco Research Division of The Western Company of North America proposes a surface lease on a tract approximately 750 feet x 750 feet (12.91 acres) in the NW/4, Section 11, Block 6, University Lands, Andrews County for explosive testing under a research contract with the Navy Department. This is to be explosive bulge testing on steel plates using up to 100 pounds of pentolite. The shots will be done in a pit or revetment and will be no hazard to anything in the surrounding area other than noise. The actual test site will be fenced. It is more than 5 miles from any habitation and is removed from present oil field activity. The lessee has made arrangements with Mr. Arnold Scharbauer, the grazing tenant, and will be responsible for any damages to him and, of course, responsible for any other damages resulting from its operations. The lease will be for one year beginning November 1, 1962, with the right to renew from year to year up to 10 years. Rental will be \$250 annually. It is recommended that the Board of Regents authorize this lease to be executed by its Chairman when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

AMENDMENT TO WATER CONTRACT NO. 85, PAN AMERICAN PETROLEUM CORPORATION, ANDREWS COUNTY.—This contract for non-potable water from the Santa Rosa formation in Block 4, Andrews County, was granted by the Board of Regents in October and November, 1959, for a pilot waterflood project in the McFarland Queen Field. Pan American Petroleum Corporation advises that the completion of the waterflood requires the furnishing of water from the Santa Rosa formation to four lease line (offsetting) wells, but the water contract limits the use of the water to the unit area. Water will be furnished by Pan American to the companies involved as nearly as possible at actual cost. There was no charge for Water Contract No. 85 and there will be none for the amendment.

It is recommended that the amendment to Water Contract No. 85 be approved allowing such use of the water, with the instrument to be executed by the Chairman of the Board after approval as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

WATER EXPLORATION PERMIT NO. 99 WITH OPTION TO LEASE TO THE TOWN OF PECOS CITY (PECOS), PART OF BLOCK 16, WARD COUNTY .-- The Town of Pecos City (Pecos), Reeves County, proposes a water exploration permit and lease option agreement in line with policy of the Board of Regents for ground water leases to municipalities. This permit is to cover Sections 7, 15, 16 and 17; W/2 of Section 18; E/2 of Section 21; Block 16, University Lands, Ward County, Texas, comprising approximately 2,963.6 acres, more or less. It will be for a term of 5 years. If the permit is released or the lease option exercised before the end of the 2 years, there will be no charge for the permit. For any additional year beyond the 2 years, but for no more than a total of 5years from the effective date that the permit is in effect, Pecos will pay for the permit at the rate of \$600 annually in advance. At any time during the effective term of the permit, Pecos will have the exclusive right to lease for a term of 50 years all or any part of the acreage in units of not less than 1/2 sections for the production for municipal purposes of potable water or water capable of being made potable, except for such water that may be required by the University's surface lessees for domestic and livestock purposes and by the University's oil, gas and mineral lessees. However, such water may not be used by University lessees for pressure maintenance or waterflooding projects. The water lease will carry a royalty to the University of not less than 2-1/2 cents per 1,000 gallons of gross water produced or 12-1/2% of the commercial rate charged by Pecos, whichever is the greater. Minimum royalty will be \$5,000 annually.

It is recommended that the Board of Regents grant this water exploration permit and lease option agreement and authorize its Chairman to execute the appropriate instrument when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

REPORT ON TRUST AND SPECIAL FUNDS INVESTMENTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED AUGUST 31, 1962.—Under separate bound cover, the Land and Investment Committee presents a report on Trust and Special Funds investments for the fiscal year ended August 31, 1962. During the year, the Committee made periodic reports of purchases, sales and other transactions for the various funds, all of which were duly approved by the Board of Regents. The present report is intended to provide a summary of the investments held for the various trust and special funds as of August 31, 1962.

#### TRUST AND SPECIAL FUNDS - REAL ESTATE MATTERS. --

TEXAS WESTERN COLLEGE - FRANK B. COTTON TRUST - CORRECTION IN RECOMMENDATION OF GRAZING LEASE IN HUDSPETH COUNTY TO W. B. EVANS.—At the October, 1962, meeting of the Board of Regents, approval was given for a 1-year lease to W. B. Evans on 18,191 acres in Hudspeth County. The statement was made in the recommendation, which was from Mr. Evans' application, that the new lease included acreage in Sections 21 and 35, Block 3, GC&SF Ry. Grant. Those sections were in the original lease and therefore the statement concerning their inclusion in the new lease should be deleted. The total acreage and rental remains the same.

MAIN UNIVERSITY - BRACKENRIDGE TRACT - RECOMMENDATIONS REGARD-ING USE OF THE BRACKENRIDGE TRACT AND STEPS TO BE TAKEN ON TITLE QUESTIONS. --At the October, 1962, meeting of the Board of Regents, the Land and Investment Committee instructed the staff to submit recommendations regarding the Brackenridge Tract.

It is recommended that the Board of Regents adopt a policy to hold all of this tract indefinitely for future development of the University so that none of the land will be sold or developed commercially, beyond the three commercial leases now in effect, and any renewal of those leases as may be determined by the Board, and the municipal golf course lease now in effect, by adopting the following resolution:

WHEREAS, on June 17, 1910, George W. Brackenridge conveyed in trust for the benefit of The University of Texas until the death of certain named persons with remainder over in fee simple to the State of Texas for the benefit of The University of Texas, in trust, approximately 500 acres in the Daniel J. Gilbert League, George W. Speer League, and Henry P. Hill League in Travis County, Texas, recorded in Book 244, pages 77-78 of the Deed Records of Travis County, Texas, which is commonly referred to as the "Brackenridge Tract"; and

WHEREAS, On October 22, 1910, the Board of Regents of The University of Texas, pursuant to resolution recorded in Volume D, page 69 of the minutes of the Board of Regents of The University of Texas, accepted said land for the purpose of promoting University education; and

WHEREAS, the present and prospective expansion needs of The University of Texas require additional acreage to facilitate and carry forward its programs; and

WHEREAS, the Brackenridge Tract is ideally situated for the location of University buildings and utilization for other University projects:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Regents of The University of Texas, that the Brackenridge Tract be reserved and set apart for University needs in its building program and for projects connected with the University, and that said tract be used exclusively for the orderly development of The University of Texas.

It is further recommended that the Board of Regents request the Attorney General to take appropriate action, after consultation with attorneys to be selected and retained by the Board of Regents, to accomplish the following:

(1) Obtain a release of the reversionary interest from the appropriate authorities of Jackson County for the sum of \$1,000 to be paid by the Board of Regents.

- (2) If the Jackson County release is not obtained, file a condemnation suit or other appropriate legal action against the reversionary interest in a District Court of Travis County and pursue such suit to judgment.
- (3) At the appropriate time, file a declaratory judgment suit in a District Court in Travis County to construe the deed from Geo. W. Brackenridge dated June 17, 1910, and determine that this tract is not a part of the Permanent University Fund.

TEXAS WESTERN COLLEGE - FRANK B. COTTON TRUST - OIL, GAS, AND MINERAL LEASE TO LEE GILLILAND ON ACREAGE IN CULBERSON AND HUDSPETH COUNTIES .-- Mr. Lee Gilliland of San Antonio proposes on behalf of a principal whose name will be disclosed prior to action by the Board of Regents an oil, gas, and mineral lease covering all of the Frank B. Cotton Trust Lands in Culberson and Hudspeth Counties amounting to 23,861.25 acres in Hudspeth County and 12,502.05 acres in Culberson County, or a total of 36,363.30, as per deeds from the Frank B. Cotton Estate to the Board of Regents. The proposal is for a primary term of 10 years, bonus at \$2.00 per acre, delay rental of \$.50 per acre annually, 1/8 royalty, and shutin gas royalty equal to delay rental but limited to 5 years beyond the primary term. The acreage to be held by production by any one well will be limited to 4 sections. In the event royalty from production does not equal delay rental on the acreage held, the difference will be paid to the lessor. Pooling will be limited to 40 acres for oil and 640 acres for gas with 10% tolerance. The proposal is subject to title examination.

In line with recommendations by President Ray and Business Manager St. Clair, University Lands - Geology, and Central Administration, your Committee recommends that the Board accept this proposal and authorize its Chairman to execute the lease when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

HOGG FOUNDATION: W. C. HOGG FUND - McASHAN PROPERTY, MAIN AND CLAY, HOUSTON, TEXAS - PROPOSED PARKING LOT LEASE TO CHARLES GUOKAS, JR.-- A 3-year parking lot lease with Mr. Charles Guokas, Jr., at \$1,550 per month rental on the McAshan property at Main and Clay in Houston expires February 28, 1963, and Mr. Guokas has proposed a lease for another 3 years at guaranteed rental of \$1,600 per month and in addition 50% of any gross receipts over \$30,000 annually. The lease will allow cancellation by the Board of Regents in the event of sale or long-term lease. Poster advertising sign rentals are reserved to the University and amount to \$510 annually. The proposal made by Mr. Guokas appears better than can be obtained from any other responsible operator, and he has been a good tenant. It is recommended that the Board of Regents authorize a new lease under the proposed terms to be executed by the Chairman when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

RESEARCH CONTRACTS: The following contracts and amendments have been negotiated by the Office of Government Sponsored Research and have been signed by the Vice-President and/or President upon the recommendation of the appropriate Technical Director, the Director of the Office of Government Sponsored Research, and the Business Manager. I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

- 1. Modification No. 7, Supplemental Agreement to Contract  $\mathcal{M}$ -303 $\mathcal{A}$  AF 19(604)-3498, by which the Department of the Air Force, Electronic Systems Division, Air Force Systems Command, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, establishes a fixed overhead rate of 35.5% of Salaries and Wages for the period September 1, 1958 through August 31, 1960. The study and application of digital data-processing methods to the problem of sensing and recording meteorological variables at various levels on a 1400-ft. tower were performed in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. W. Straiton, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 2. Modification No. 2, Change Order to Contract AF 33(616)-7994, M-307; by which the Department of the Air Force, Aeronautical Systems
  Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, incorporates into the contract ASD Form 151, "Contract Security Classification List," dated August 13, 1962, in lieu of DD Form 254 presently included.

  The research on linear operator techniques and their application to defense analysis and synthesis was conducted in the Military Physics Research Laboratory under the direction of A. E. Lockenvitz, Professor of Physics.
- 3. Modification No. 1, Supplemental Agreement to Contract

  AF 49(638)-1115, by which the Department of the Air Force, Office of
  Scientific Research, Washington, D. C., reduces the contract sum by
  \$45,000.00. The budget of Contract AF 49(638)-1115 included funds
  for radiometric analyses for isotope-ratio measurements applicable to
  geologic age determinations. Dr. Muchlberger has decided that this
  work can be more advantageously performed by the U. S. Department of
  Interior Geological Survey, therefore the Air Force is decreasing the
  contract sum by \$45,000.00 and transferring this sum to the Department
  of Interior. The investigation of the buried crust of the North
  American continent continues under the direction of Dr. William R.

#### BUSINESS CONTRACT ITEMS

I recommend approval of the following contracts executed on behalf of Texas Western College:

- 1. Contract with C & G Roofing Company, 5431 Frutas, El Paso, Texas, to place a built-up roof on a concrete deck area of the Student Union Building. Invitations to bid were sent to three roofing companies. C & G Roofing Company submitted the only bid and in the amount of \$ 325.00. The funds for this contract will come from Auxiliary Enterprises Student Union Funds.
- 2. Contract with the Brunswick Automatic Pinsetter Corporation to install automatic pinsetters for the four bowling alleys in the Student Union Building on a lease basis with the rental paid to be applied to the purchase of the pinsetters at the option of the College. The monthly rental will be computed on the basis of the use of each pinsetter with the rate decreasing as the use increases. The minimum annual rental is \$ 800.00 per pinsetter. Texas Western College is paying more than \$ 6,500.00 a year to hire individuals to set pins. One of the principal advantages of this arrangement is that it will free the College from the necessity of employing an undesirable type of person for work on the campus.
