The following docket for The University of Texas at Austin is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on December 3, 1971.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

CONTRACTS and GRANTS (Federal):

- 1. Modification AFOSR-69-1764B to Grant AFOSR-69-1764, by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, extends the period of the grant through September 30, 1971, and establishes the indirect cost rate of 43.5% of salaries and wages for the period September 14, 1971 through September 30, 1971. The research entitled, "Adaptive Information Systems for Decision Making," continues under the direction of Dr. D. G. Lainiotis, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 2. Modification AFOSR-67-766F to Grant AFOSR-766-67, by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, transfers title to certain items of equipment to the grantee. The basic research in electronics was under the direction of Dr. C. L. Coates, Professor of Electrical Engineering and of Computer Sciences.
- 3. Modification AFOSR 69-1764C to Grant AFOSR 69-1764, by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides \$49,912 additional funds, increases the total amount to \$136,516 and extends the period of the contract through September 30, 1972. The research entitled, "Adaptive Information Systems for Decision Making," continues under the direction of Dr. D.G. Lainiotis, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 4. Modification AFOSR 69-1792C to Grant AFOSR 69-1792, by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, deletes certain equipment listed in Amendment A to the grant and adds certain other items of equipment. The research entitled, "Basic Research in Electronics (JSEP)," was under the direction of Dr. C. L. Coates, Professor of Electrical Engineering and of Computer Sciences.

- 5. Modification P00005, Change Order to Contract F33615-70-C-1162, by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, provides \$123,766 to complete total funding of the \$373,766 estimated cost of the contract, and updates Form DD 254. The research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 6. Modification P00003, Change Order to Contract F33615-71-C-1350, by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, provides \$109,587 to complete funding of the \$309,587 total estimated cost. The research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 7. Modification P002, Supplemental Agreement to Contract F44620-71-C-0091, by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, transfers certain items of Government property from Grant AFOSR-69-1792 to Contract F44620-71-C-0091. The research entitled, "Basic Research in Electronics (JSEP)," continues under the direction of Dr. Arwin A. Dougal, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 8. Modification P003, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DAAG 39-67-C-0082, by which the Department of the Army, U.S. Army Material Command, Harry Diamond Laboratories, Washington, D. C., sets a fixed overhead rate of 43.5% of salaries and wages for the period of the contract and increases the cost by \$1,065.14 to a new total of \$17,706.14. The research entitled, "The Nature of the Species Present in Ammonia Solutions of Elemental Substances," was conducted by Dr. J. J. Lagowski, Professor of Chemistry.
- 9. Contract DAAK 02-72-C-0044, by which the Department of the Army, U. S. Army Mobility Equipment, Research and Development Center, Fort Belvoir, Virginia, provides \$14,960 for support of research entitled, "NMR in Intercalated Compounds." The contract is effective for the period September 28, 1971 through November 27, 1972, and the research will be under the direction of Dr. George E. Fredericks, Assistant Professor of Physics.
- 10. Modification P00005 to Basic Contract N00014-70-A-0166, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Arlington, Virginia, incorporates the Stabilization of Prices, Rents, Wages and Salaries (1971 August) Clause into the basic contract and the substance of this clause into all subcontracts issued under it.
- 11. Modification No. 01, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N00014-70-A-0166-0003, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides \$25,000 additional funds and increases the total estimated cost of the contract to \$125,000 for a period extended through May 31, 1972. The research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 12. Contract N00017-72-C-1405, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ordnance Systems Command, Washington, D. C., provides \$450,000 for support of an evaluation of measures-countermeasures systems and techniques. The contract is effective for the period October 16, 1971 through October 15, 1972, and the work will be performed in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

- 13. Modification P00005 to Contract N00024-70-C-1089, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., extends the period of the contract through June 30, 1972, at no increase in estimated cost. Research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 14. Modification P00003 to Contract N00024-71-C-1073, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., extends the period of the contract through March 31, 1972, or until all funds shall have been expended, whichever occurs first. Research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 15. Modification P00007, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N00024-71-C-1185, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., transfers and vests accountability of certain material in possession of Purdue Research Foundation to The University of Texas at Austin. Research under this contract continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 16. Modification P00002, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N00024-71-C-1213, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., deletes Exhibit A, DD Form 1423 dated May 10, 1971, in its entirety and substitutes therefor another dated July 27, 1971, without otherwise changing the contract. The research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 17. Modification P00002, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N00024-71-C-1309, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., incorporates into the contract advance payments, finding and authority clauses in accordance with the Advance Payment Pool Agreement between the Government and the University, dated February 3, 1971. Research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 18. Modification P00003, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N00024-71-C-1309, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., provides \$95,000 for additional work under the contract and increases the total estimated cost to \$190,000. The research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 19. Contract N00123-72-C-0442, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Regional Procurement Office, Los Angeles, California, provides \$5,000 for support of ISDS Component Repair/Rework. The contract is effective for the period September 1, 1971 through June 30, 1972, and the work will be performed by Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 20. Modification No. 17, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(11-1)-490, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, extends the period of the contract through December 31, 1971. The research entitled, "Transport of Radionuclides in Water (Model River and Ecological Systems)" continues under the direction of Dr. Earnest F. Gloyna, Professor of Civil Engineering.

- 21. Modification No. 19, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(40-1)-1639, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, adds \$30,012 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through August 31, 1972. The research entitled, "Unusual Oxidation States of Transitional Elements," continues under the direction of Dr. George W. Watt, Professor of Chemistry.
- 22. Modification No. 8, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(40-1)-3408, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, adds \$15,000 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through August 14, 1972. The physico-chemical studies of radiation effects on cells continues under the direction of Dr. E. L. Powers, Professor of Zoology.
- 23. Grant No. 14-31-0001-3673, by which the U.S. Department of the Interior, Office of Water Resources Research, Washington, D. C., provides \$16,830 for support of research entitled, "An Investigation of the Optimal Expansion of a Water Resources System." The grant is effective for the period September 1, 1971 through August 31, 1973, and the research will be under the direction of Dr. David M. Himmelblau, Professor of Chemical Engineering.
- 24. Change Order No. 2 to Contract No. 14-10-7:931-24, by which the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, Arizona Archeological Center, University of Arizona, Tucson, changes the date of submission of the final report to February 28, 1972. The test excavations at selected archeological sites in the Wallisville Reservoir, Texas, continue under the direction of Dr. David S. Dibble, Acting Director, Texas Archeological Salvage Project.

Grant GM 09654-11, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, provides \$36,527 for support of research entitled, "Studies on Histone Metabolism." The grant is effective for the period October 1, 1971 through September 30, 1975, and the \$36,527 now appropriated is for the period October 1, 1971 through September 30, 1972. The research continues under the direction of Dr. David P. Bloch, Professor of Botany.
- 30. Grant HD06160-01, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, provides \$59,893 for support of a population research center grant proposal. The grant is effective for the period September 1,1971 through August 31,1976, and the \$59,893 now appropriated is for the period September 1,1971 through August 31,1972. The research will be under the direction of Dr. Harley L. Browning, Professor of Sociology.

Grant MH16899-03, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, provides \$22,526 for support of research entitled, "Development of Behavior and Genetics." The grant is effective for the period September 1, 1971 through August 31, 1974, and the \$22,526 now appropriated is for the period September 1, 1971, through August 31, 1972. The research continues under the direction of Dr. Martin Manosevitz, Associate Professor of Psychology.
- 34. Grant NS 08251-04, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, provides \$22,545 for support of research entitled, "Physiology of Chemoreception." 

APPOINTMENT OF VICE PRESIDENT FOR ACADEMIC AFFAIRS. President Stephen H. Spurr, has appointed Dr. Peter T. Flawn, Vice President for Academic Affairs ad interim, to the position of Vice President for Academic Affairs with a salary based upon the same budgeted level as that set for his predecessor for the academic year 1969-70.

J. PAT O'KEEFE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND. Mr. W. H. "Deacon" Crain, of Austin, Texas, has given the Department of Drama \$3,500 to establish a memorial scholarship in the memory of J. Pat O'Keefe, a 1940 graduate of the College of Fine Arts at The University of Texas of Texas at Austin.

GEOLOGY FOUNDATION PROFESSORSHIP. The Fondren Foundation of Houston, Texas, has sent The University of Texas at Austin a check in the amount of \$25,000 to be used in establishing an endowed professorship in energy resources or petroleum geology. It is understood that additional gifts amounting to \$75,000 will be necessary before the position in question can become a reality. The contribution was obtained through the efforts of Mr. John J. Loftis, Jr., Houston, Texas, who is a member of the Advisory Council of the Geology Foundation.

FACULTY LEGISLATION. The following legislation has been passed by the University Council and/or General Faculty. I recommend approval.

Proposed Change in the Statement of the University's Final Examination Policy. The University Council on September 20, 1971, adopted the following proposed change in the statement of the University's final examination policy (D&P 4923).

From:

The Faculty has specified that no exemption from final examinations should be given except in courses of such character as to make an examination at all undesirable.....

To:

Faculty members are free to develop their own method of evaluating the performance of students in their courses, but they are required to make the methods of evaluation to be used known to their classes in writing

before the end of the add-drop period. Responsibility for assuring adequate methods of evaluation rests with the department faculties and is subject to administrative review. In courses with multiple sections, the departments should provide for necessary coordination. The final examination remains the most favored and general method of final evaluation in courses.

CORRECTION IN OCTOBER 22, 1971 DOCKET (Page M-23, "Changes in Requirements for PhD Candidates". The item entitled "Changes in Requirements for PhD Candidates" on Page M-23 of the October 22, 1971, Docket was erroneously reported in the minutes of the meeting of the Graduate Assembly to this office as "Proposals for Changes in Requirements for Ph.D. Candidates. This item should be corrected in the following manner: The heading should be "Resolutions on Degree Programs (replacing the heading "Proposals for Changes in Requirements for Ph.D. Candidates) as this pertains to all graduate students rather than just Ph.D.Candidates.

NEW CAREERS PROJECT. Agreement between The University of Texas at Austin and Austin New Careers Program of the Human Opportunities Corporation of Austin and Travis County signed by President Stephen H. Spurr, whereby the University agrees to provide on the job training and related skill training in accordance with the plans submitted as part of the agreement. The period covered is from October 25, 1971 until terminated. This is a new program designed to develop sub-professional aide or assistant-type positions for low income unemployed persons.

"ASSOCIATED HEALTH OCCUPATIONS James L. Cantwell, B.A., B.S., O.T.R., M.P.O.T. Chairman

The School of Allied Health Sciences has developed and implemented, in cooperation with Galveston College, a paraprofessional program leading toward associate degrees and certificates of proficiency. This two year program prepares men and women to enter the health care system as community health workers, electroencephalography technologists, hospital management assistants, inhalation therapists, occupational therapy assistants, orthotic assistants, physical therapy assistants, and radiologic technologists.

Upon completion of the two year course of study these individuals enter practice under the direct supervision of the respective physician, therapist, technologist, or administrator. The community health worker assists the social worker and the community health specialist in programs which are organized and implemented to foster the maintenance of health or prevention of illness and disability within community settings. The electroencephalography technologist aids the physician in diagnostic procedures through the tracing and recording of brain waves and preparing preliminary interpretations of findings. Hospital management assistants work under administrators in designated areas of clinics and hospitals, such as admitting offices, transportation, ward services, laundry and house-keeping.

The registered inhalation therapist works under the supervision of the physician with patients who are in need of corrective or assistive respiratory treatment. The certified occupational therapy assistant serves under the registered occupational therapist in planning and implementing a wide variety of activity programs for patients presenting psychosocial, physical disability, and developmental health problems.

The orthotic assistant works in the production and fitting of braces or assistive appliances under the direction of a certified orthotist. The physical therapy assistant carries out techniques and procedures designed to alleviate or prevent physically disabling or handicapping conditions, under the direction of the qualified physical therapist. The radiologic technologist performs a variety of tasks related to diagnostic x-rays and therapeutic radiation and serves under the supervision of the radiologist.

Upon successful completion of the educational and clinical program, graduates are eligible to apply for registration or certification and membership in their respective national professional associations. Those which permit registration through examination are: electroencephalography technology, inhalation therapy, and radiologic technology. Certification is available to occupational therapy assistants, physical therapy assistants, and orthotic assistants. Community health workers and hospital management assistants do not have national registries at this time.

Graduates of the Associated Health Occupations program are in great demand. A wide variety of employment opportunities await the qualified individual in teaching and general hospitals, specialty hospitals and clinics, rehabilitation facilities, nursing and extended care institutions, state and federal hospitals, and the Peace Corps.

Entrance Requirements. Admission to the Associated Health Occupations program is only through Galveston College. Applicants must complete and submit an official application; arrange for previous school records to be sent directly to the College Registrar; and arrange for counseling interviews prior to formal registration. In order to be eligible for admission to the Associated Health Occupations course of study the student must be a graduate of an accredited high school or hold a General Education Development certificate and submit scores on the American College Test. In addition, the prospective student must complete an interview with the Chairman of the Department of Associated Health Occupations or his designated representative.

General Studies. During the two years of study the student enrolls in a number of general studies such as English, psychology, sociology, anatomy, physiology, mathematics, and government which are prerequisites for the associate degree.

Professional Science Course of Study. In order for the student to acquire basic scientific knowledge and skills which are directly related to health care practices, the student also enrolls in courses which are specific to the requirements for entry into the health care disciplines. Such courses may be microbiology, chemistry, biomedical physics, and those behavioral sciences which are directly applicable to the student's choice of clinical specialty.

Associated Health Occupations Core Curriculum. Upon admission to the Associated Health Occupations program the freshman student enters into the academic portion of his studies. This general core is conducted at Galveston College and consists of anatomy and physiology, English, psychology and sociology. Simultaneously, a second core of study related to health care delivery is provided through the School of Allied Health Sciences. These two core programs prepare the student for entry into specialized areas of clinical study.

Specialized Didactic and Clinical Study. The sophomore year of study is designed as clinical education. Clinical studies are arranged to meet all established essentials for registration or certification and are designed to provide the student with skills, knowledge, and practical experiences which enable him to perform as a member of the health team.

Degree and Certificate of Proficiency. Upon successful completion of all academic requirements the student is awarded the degree of Associate of Applied Science from Galveston College. Upon successful completion of additional clinical requirements the graduate receives a Certificate of Proficiency from the School of Allied Health Sciences, indicating that he is competent to practice in a specialty area.

Accreditation. The study programs for electroencephalography technology, inhalation therapy, occupational therapy assistant, orthotics assistant, and radiologic technologist meet and exceed the educational standards as estab-

lished by the American Medical Association, Council on Medical Education, and the respective associations. The programs for hospital management assistant and community health worker do not at this time have national educational standards; however, these programs meet and exceed nationally recognized criteria.

Statement of the Profession

The latest addition to the contemporary health care team is the clinical associate, also known as the physician's assistant. The emergence of this new professional is due to many factors: the rapid expansion of the population; the increasing demand on the part of individuals for adequate health and medical care; the emerging need for more health related personnel in rural and inner city geographic areas; the increased attention of governmental agencies upon preventive aspects of the nation's health problems; and the inability of medical schools to greatly augment student enrollment, thereby producing more physician personnel. The physician himself has determined the need for the clinical associate as a supportive person: an individual to whom he may delegate distinct tasks and responsibilities, and thus better meet the demands placed upon him by his patients.

The Board of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences has stated that the appropriate avenue to adequate health care is through "better clinical support systems to help the physician deliver . . . more units of personal health services per hour of his working day . . . " For this to be accomplished new types of health workers, particularly those who can serve as immediate extensions of the physician, need to be educated and placed in the health care systems. Similarly, the Council on Health Manpower of the American Medical Association has recommended a working definition of one who would serve in a capacity of an assistant to a physician: ". . . a skilled person qualified by academic and practical training to provide patient services under the supervision and direction of a licensed physician who is responsible for the performance of that individual."

The Association of American Medical Colleges, in defining the roles for the clinical associate, or physician's assistant, has indicated he should be able to perform a history and physical examination; to organize and present the results of the history and examination, along with related laboratory data; to perform certain diagnostic and therapeutic procedures; and to coordinate the roles of other technical assistants. In essence, the clinical associate differs from other allied health science personnel in that he is largely educated and trained by physicians, is selected by physicians who share their practice by delegating certain tasks and responsibilities and is directly and administratively responsible to the physician.

The School of Allied Health Sciences has developed a two year professional curriculum leading to the Bachelor of Science degree in Health Care Sciences and the Certificate of Proficiency. This program prepares young men and women to become clinical associates in one of several medical specialty areas, such as family practice, internal medicine, neurosurgery, and pediatrics. Graduates are able to function at a high level of performance,

typified by the Type A Assistant as defined by the Association of American Medical Colleges and the National Academy of Sciences. They can assist the physician in multiple and complex tasks directly related to health and medical care: interviewing, examining, compiling case record data, treatment, follow-up care, maintaining a continuity of communications and observations, and coordinating other physician-related personnel. Under special circumstances with defined rules, they can perform tasks and carry out responsibilities without the immediate surveillance of a physician; nevertheless, they remain directly responsible to the physician who employs them.

Pre-Professional Course of Study

Prior to admission to the professional curriculum in health care sciences in the School of Allied Health Sciences, the student must have completed a minimum of sixty (60) semester hours credit in specific courses with a minimum 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale on all previous course work.

The pre-professional course of study is based on the liberal arts and sciences core curriculum as adopted by the Association of Texas Colleges and Universities. The pre-professional course of study may be accomplished at any accredited junior college, senior college or university having a lower division and must include the following:

A maximum of eight (8) semester credits may be accepted from junior college courses of study in associated health occupations or nursing as electives. These semester hours may be accepted for elective credit only and cannot be substituted for any other pre-professional course requirements.

In order to be considered for admission the student must also accomplish the following:

- 1. Achieve acceptable scores on the admission test battery of the Department of Health Care Sciences.
- 2. Complete a personal interview with members of the Admissions

- Committee of the Department of Health Care Sciences.
- 3. Present evidence of good physical and mental health.
- 4. Provide acceptable letters of reference as may be required by the Department of Health Care Sciences.

The student already holding a baccalaureate degree in a related field may enroll and pursue a second bachelor's degree provided he has successfully completed the previously stated pre-professional course requirements.

The Professional Curriculum

Upon admission to the two year professional curriculum in the School of Allied Health Sciences, the student enters the established core curriculum, consisting of twenty-eight (28) semester credits in advanced basic sciences, the clinical sciences, and health-related subjects. These courses are designed to help the individual develop an in-depth understanding and appreciation of the foundations underlying health care practices today. Emphasis is placed upon an on-going dialogue with other allied health students and faculty so that basic perceptions about the contemporary health team can be realized. Running concurrently with the core curriculum in allied health sciences are a series of specially designed courses for clinical associate students. These courses provide the basic principles and fundamental techniques of clinical associate practice. Introductory clinical experiences, supervised by physicians, are provided which permit application of basic knowledge and skills.

The senior year is devoted to a major area of study, selected by the student, consisting of intensive didactic instruction and specialized clinical training under the direct superivision of qualified physicians. At the present time specialty training is provided in family practice, internal medicine, and neurosurgery. Other clinical specialties are in the planning phase and will be implemented within the foreseeable future.

An in-depth emphasis is placed upon those skills the clinical associate employs in the area of specialization; such as, comprehensive and detailed history taking and physical examination; selection and ordering of pertinent laboratory studies, assisting the physician in therapeutic procedures; the provision of follow-up care; and supervision of other technical personnel.

The student specializing in family practice gains course work and clinical experience in such subject areas as labor and delivery examinations and procedures, pediatric screening tests, diagnosis and management of childhood diseases, preventive medicine, guidance and counseling of parents and children, out-patient procedures, emergency room methods and techniques, cardiopulmonary function tests, cardiac resuscitation, and electrocardiography.

Those students who elect to specialize in internal medicine receive course work and clinical experience in such areas as gastroenterologic diagnostic and clinical procedures, hemotologic problems, electrocardiography and medical instrumentation in coronary care units, and emergency room procedures. Follow-up care is emphasized through out-patient clinical experiences.

Specialization in neurosurgery provides the student with didactic and clinical experiences in history taking and in-depth neurological examinations, assisting in carotid arteriography, pneumoencephalography, special nursing

care of the critically ill patient, and follow-up post-surgical examinations.

Post-hospital reviews are undertaken through outpatient experiences.

A typical rotational clinical internship might be:

Adult male and female medicine ward	12 weeks
Pediatric medicine ward	4 weeks
Outpatient Services of Family Practice Clinic	16 weeks
Emergency Room	4 weeks
Special Electives	12 weeks

Upon completion of academic and clinical training requirements, the student is awarded the degree Bachelor of Science in Health Care Sciences. He also receives a Certificate of Proficiency indicating he is a Clinical Associate in the specialized area in which he concentrated his studies during the senior year.

The Health Care Sciences curriculum meets and exceeds nationally recognized educational standards for such a course of study. Graduates are eligible to apply for membership with The American Registry of Physician's Associates, Inc., and The American Association of Physician Assistants.

The Professional Course of Study

The professional curriculum which is six trimesters in length includes the allied health sciences core curriculum, the basic and advanced courses in the major and the clinical practice required for certification within a specialty area.

Description of Courses

These courses are open to Health Care Science majors only or with consent of the departmental chairman.

Fundamental Concepts of Health Care Sciences I 3 credits

Basic principles and fundamental techniques of history taking and the physical examination of patients are presented. Skill in pre-diagnostic techniques is emphasized as well as the correlation of information required for a concise and coherent summary of clinical findings. (2 lec., 3 lab. per week).

Fundamental Concepts of Health Care Sciences II 3 credits
Continuation of 3315. Principles and techniques of case presentation are developed with emphasis upon etiology, pathology, signs and

- symptoms, clinical course of disease or condition, complications and treatment. Seminars and patient presentation methods are utilized. (3 lec. per week).

Thus, the medical technologist occupies a responsible key position on the health team."

"The opportunities for a medical technologist are unlimited. Because this field has grown so rapidly in recent years, the demand for qualified medical technologists far exceeds the number of trained people. Medical technology education offers a broad based background for future work and advancement. The well educated [TRAINED] technologist may choose his place of employment from such areas as hospitals, clinics, the armed forces, public health agencies, biological manufacturers and research laboratories. Technologists may work in a general clinical laboratory or specialize in a particular field such as microbiology, hematology, blood banking, clinical chemistry, immunology [HISTOPATHOLOGY] or parasitology. Supervisory, administrative and teaching positions are also available to those medical technologists with work experience, offering an opportunity for professional growth and advancement. Graduate degree programs offer a diversified selection for medical technologists. He may choose from one of the laboratory disciplines for further study, or if his interest lies in teaching and administration, programs are also available in these areas."

(39) Amend paragraph four (4) Statement Of The Profession as follows:

"Men and women considering a career in medical technology should have a genuine interest in science, a stable well-rounded personality and a desire to serve. Medical technologists must be capable of working cooperatively with others under supervision and at the same time have the ability to supervise and impart knowledge to others. The technologist must be reliable and personally responsible for test results. Precision, accuracy and speed are necessary in the modern clinical laboratory. Education is a continuous process and the graduate medical technologist must [BE WILLING TO] continue to study and learn in order to better serve the patient and advance the science of laboratory medicine."

THE TWELVE-MONTH TEACHING PROGRAM IS DIVIDED INTO TWO SIX-MONTH PERIODS. THE FIRST SIX MONTHS OF INSTRUCTION IS DIDACTIC, EMPLOYING LECTURES AND A TEACHING LABORATORY WITH INTEGRATION OF PRACTICAL AND THEORETICAL MATERIAL. THE SECOND SIX MONTHS CONSISTS OF ROTATION THROUGH THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS OF THE CLINICAL LABORATORY AFFORDING AMPLE OPPORTUNITY IN THE INTEGRATION OF SKILLS THROUGH EXPERIENCE UNDER THE GUIDANCE AND SUPERVISION OF REGISTERED MEDICAL TECHNOLOGISTS. THE STUDENT IS GIVEN EVERY OPPORTUNITY TO LEARN FROM PHYSICIANS, PARTICULARLY THOSE WHO ARE CLINICAL PATHOLOGISTS.

DURING THE FIRST SIX MONTHS OF DIDACTIC INSTRUCTION CLASSES ARE HELD IN CLASSROOMS AND TWO TEACHING LABORATORIES IN THE SCHOOL OF ALLIED HEALTH SCIENCES. EACH DAY CONSISTS OF TWO FOUR HOUR SESSIONS, EACH SESSION CONSISTING OF A ONE HOUR LECTURE FOLLOWED BY A THREE HOUR LABORATORY. IN MOST INSTANCES DIFFERENT SUBJECTS ARE COVERED IN THE MORNING AND AFTERNOON SESSIONS.

THE TIME PERIOD FOR EACH COURSE IN THE DIDACTIC PERIOD RANGES FROM THREE WEEKS (15 SESSIONS) TO NINE WEEKS (45 SESSIONS)
DEPENDING UPON THE TIME NECESSARY TO ADEQUATELY COVER THE SUBJECT MATERIAL. THE TIME PERIOD IN THE CORRESPONDING DEPARTMENT DURING ROTATION IN THE CLINICAL LABORATORY RANGES FROM ONE WEEK TO EIGHT WEEKS PROVIDING ADEQUATE OPPORTUNITY FOR THE STUDENT TO DEVELOP TECHNICAL SKILLS NECESSARY IN THE PERFORMANCE OF LABORATORY PROCEDURES.]"

 - [6211. MEDICAL GENETICS.--LECTURES AND CONFERENCES ON THE APPLICATION OF GENETIC PRINCIPLES TO DEVELOPMENT, FUNCTION, AND DISEASES OF MAN. LECTURE AND CONFERENCE, THREE HOURS A WEEK; SECOND SEMESTER. TWO SEMESTER HOURS.]
- (5) Add the following course:
 - Basic Neuroscience. -- A lecture and laboratory course stressing the basic principles of neuro-anatomy and neurophysiology as they relate to the normal and diseased human nervous system.

 - "63[4]05. Pathogenic Bacteriology. -- A study of bacterial human pathogens and their roles in infectious diseases. This is an advanced level course.

 Prerequisite: Microbiology 66[9]01 or permission of instructor. Lecture, two [THREE] hours a week; laboratory, four [SIX] hours a week. Three [FOUR] semester hours. \$8 laboratory fee."

- "6307. Parasitology. --Host-parasite relationships of medically-important protozoa, helminths and arthropods. Prerequisite: Microbiology 6601 or permission of instructor. Lecture, two hours a week; conference, one hour a week; laboratory, two hours a week. Three semester hours. \$4 laboratory fee."
- (8) Change course number 6308 from:
 - [6308. IMMUNOLOGY I. --HOST-PARASITE RELATION-SHIPS WITH EMPHASIS ON THE ROLE AND PROPERTIES OF ANTIBODIES IN ACQUIRED RESISTANCE TO INFECTION. PREREQUISITE: MICROBIOLOGY 6901. LECTURE, THREE HOURS A WEEK; LABORATORY, THREE HOURS A WEEK. THREE SEMESTER HOURS. \$4 LABORATORY FEE.]

- ''6508. Immunology. --This is a general course in immunology but with some emphasis on those aspects that operate in the host-parasite relationships involved in infectious diseases. Prerequisite:

 Microbiology 6601 or permission of instructor.

 Lecture, four hours a week; laboratory, four hours a week. Five semester hours. \$8 laboratory fee."
- (9) Delete course number 6309:
 - [6309. IMMUNOLOGY II. --HOST-PARASITE RELATION-SHIPS WITH EMPHASIS ON THE ROLE OF CELLULAR AND TISSUE FACTORS IN INNATE AND ACQUIRED RESISTANCE TO INFECTION. PREREQUISITE: MICROBIOLOGY 6901. (REQUIRES BACKGROUND IN MICROSCOPIC ANATOMY.) LECTURE, THREE HOURS A WEEK; LABORATORY, THREE HOURS A WEEK. THREE SEMESTER HOURS. \$4 LABORATORY FEE.]
- (10) Change course number 6310:
 - "6310. Bacterial Chemistry and Physiology. -- The biochemical features peculiar to various bacterial species are described and are compared with those of the animal cell. Prerequisite: A course in biochemistry [BIOCHEMISTRY 6801]. (Microbiology

66[9]01 or a course in general microbiology is recommended.) Lecture, three [FOUR AND ONE-HALF] hours a week. Three semester hours."

 - [6311. HELMINTHOLOGY.--EMPHASIS IS PLACED UPON THE PARASITIC HELMINTHS. PREREQUISITE:

 - "6614. Advanced Work. -- Assigned studies in various fields of microbiology. Prerequisite: Microbiology 66[9]01 or [6202 AND] consent of instructor. This course will vary in credit according to the work performed. Maximum credit, six semester hours."

PATHOLOGY

Course in Advanced Pathology. --This deals with such subjects as neoplastic diseases, surgical pathology, cardiovascular-renal disorders, neuropathology, electron microscopy, etc. Prerequisite: Pathology 6501 and Pathology 65[8]02 [, AND 6503]. This course will vary in credit according to the work performed. Maximum credit, nine semester hours.

 - "6306. Introduction to Pathobiology. --Correlation of cell structure as related to function to provide a basis for study of cellular pathobiology. Initial consideration is given to pathologic states. Lecture and seminars, four hours a week. Three semester hours."

- "6404. Biochemical Pharmacology. --Pharmacodynamics of drug actions in cells studied at the molecular level.

 Lecture, three hours a week; laboratory, three hours a week. Four semester hours. \$8 laboratory fee."
- (4) Change course number 6406 from:
 - [6406. ADVANCED PHARMACOLOGY. --PHARMACODYNAMICS, WITH REFERENCE TO BIOCHEMORPHIC ASPECTS AND QUANTITATIVE PHARMACOLOGY. SUPERVISED STUDY OF NEW DRUGS AND CHEMICAL ANALOGUES, SYNERGISMS, AND ANTAGONISMS. LECTURE, THREE HOURS A WEEK; LABORATORY, THREE HOURS A WEEK. FOUR SEMESTER HOURS. \$8 LABORATORY FEE.]

To:

"6406. Principles of Drug Action. --Seminars and laboratory assignments on the general principles of drug action including molecular mechanisms; absorption, distribution and elimination; metabolism; time course of action; toxicity; idiosyncrasy and pharmacogenetics; allergy resistance; tolerance and physical dependence; mutagenesis; carcinogenesis; teratogenesis; development and selection for clinical use.

Lecture, three hours a week; laboratory, two hours a week. Four semester hours. \$8 laboratory fee."

- "6308. Biometry. -- Exposition of recent developments in the design of laboratory experiments. Principles of randomization, replication, and local control, analysis of variance techniques. Discussion of various experimental designs such as randomized block, Latin Square, and factorial. Prerequisite: PM&CH 6303. Lecture, two hours a week; laboratory, four hours a week. Three semester hours. \$4 laboratory fee."

 - [6210. COMPUTER PROGRAMMING. -- BASIC INSTRUCTION IN FORTRAN PROGRAMMING WITH EMPHASIS ON SCIENTIFIC APPLICATION. EXPERIENCE WITH COMPUTER. LECTURE, ONE HOUR A WEEK; TWO SEMESTER HOURS. \$4 LABORATORY FEE.]

- Data Processing. --Introduction to principles needed for processing data files, editing, encoding, structuring, and manipulation of data as well as timing considerations. Use of canned programs, magnetic tapes, and disc files. Basic instruction in Fortran (IV) programming. Use of data processing and electronic computing equipment. Lecture, two hours a week; laboratory, four hours a week. Three semester hours."

 - "6115. Seminar.--Survey of current problems, programs and needs in the areas of preventive medicine and community health. One semester hour."

A critical review is presented of the use of estimation procedures for incidence and prevalence, distribution functions, sampling techniques, procedures for establishment of control and comparison groups, epidemic models, life table and other analytic approaches in follow-up studies, sequential analysis, retrospective and prospective analyses, competing risks estimates, longitudinal and cross-sectional approaches, measures of association and correlation. Prerequisite: Preferably, PM&CH 6303, 6204, 6308. Lecture, one hour a week; laboratory, two hours a week. Two semester hours.'

(9) Add the following course:

"6218. Chemical Ecology. --General principles of ecology and the effects of pollutants in the soil, water, and air on the ecology. Lectures include such topics as physiochemical factors; biochemical factors; growth, metabolism, and reproduction of organisms; principles of absorption, distribution, and excretion of chemicals; kinetics of growth of competing systems; carbon and nitrogen cycles; effects of chlorinated hydrocarbons, detergents, heavy metals, sulfur compounds, nitrates, phosphates, and oxidants on ecology. Course consists of thirty lecture hours. Two semester hours."
