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Listed below are U. T. System and Institutional items which I recommend for the Board's ratification or approval, as appropriate, including my report of budget changes.

# CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS

- 1. Interagency Contract IAC(72-73)-942 between The University of Texas Medical School at Houston and The University of Texas System Administration Office of the Comptroller in which the Houston Medical School agrees to pay System Administration an amount not to exceed \$26,400 for the period September 1, 1972, through August 31, 1973. The Office of the Comptroller will employ an Implementation Coordinator and a Training Coordinator to be assigned to the Information System for Management project for the benefit of the Houston Medical School during the contract year. The \$26,400 is the estimated amount needed for salaries for the two positions, plus a portion of the travel involved. The amount will be paid on vouchers presented to the Houston Medical School.
- 2. Continuation of the Basic Agreement between the United States Air Force and The University of Texas System No. F18600-73-A-0115 for the year beginning September 1, 1972. Individual contracts negotiated under this new Basic Agreement will be reported in the respective institutional dockets.

# CONTRACTS AND ACREEMENTS (Continued)

- 3. Amend the Supplemental Experience Rating Agreement between The University of Texas System Administration and Blue Cross-Blue Shield of Dallas, Texas, effective January 1, 1972, to:
  - (1) provide thirty (30) days' notice in advance of future adjustments in the Administrative Charge,
  - (2) provide for no more than one such adjustment in any twelve (12) month period,
  - (3) provide for a retroactive increase in the Administrative Charge from 8.15% to 8.5% effective January 1, 1972, due to premium taxes imposed by lawful authority,
  - (4) provide for automatic future increases due to premium taxes imposed by lawful authority, in accordance with procedures described under (1) and (2) above.
- 4. Amend The University of Texas System Contract with Blue Cross-Blue Shield to change the rate schedule applicable to all components effective January 1, 1973, to provide the necessary income to meet the actual costs of medical claims, which now exceed premium income. For the contract period January 1, 1973, through December 31, 1973, overall rates will be increased by 14.7% to meet those costs, and slight additional increases will be needed to provide for increased benefits necessary to give member employees adequate medical insurance protection.

The increased benefits are:

- (1) an increase in the room rate allowance under Major Medical of \$10 for each of the three plans;
- (2) a \$150 Accidental Injury Supplement which replaces the \$25 Emergency First Aid benefit; and
- (3) at no additional cost, coverage for dependents after the age of twenty-five if they are disabled.

In order to protect the financial soundness of the group and provide adequate insurance protection for employees, System Administration recommends that this benefit and rate increase be approved. A letter has been received from Blue Cross-Blue Shield which indicates that these new rates are in compliance with the current Price Commission Rules and Regulations.

The grant is effective for the period September 1, 1972 through June 30, 1973. The Symposia will be under the direction of Dr. L. Joe Berry, Professor of Microbiology.

<u>FACULTY LEGISLATION</u>. The following legislation has been passed by The University Council. I recommend approval.

1. The University Council has endorsed, by the circularization procedure, as of October 20, 1972, certain proposals to amend the Catalogue of the College of Natural Sciences for 1973-1975, (D&P 5253-5255).

#### RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF GEOLOGICAL SCIENCES

The Department of Geological Sciences makes the following recommendations:

That in the College of Natural Sciences catalogue for 1971-73, on page 20 under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts in Geology" under "D. Majors," the following changes be made:

- (1) From: Major: Geology 301 or 303, and 304 (or equivalent courses), 314K, 316K, 316L, 316M, 320K, 321, 328, and enough additional upper-division hours in geology to make a total of thirty-three semester hours.
  - To: Major: Geology 301 or 303, 304, 208K, 416K, 416L, 416M, 320K, 321, 322K, 328; or equivalent courses to make a total of thirty-two semester hours.

Reason: To make the requirements match revised course offerings. The requested degree change adds five hours of required courses to the degree, but lowers the total geology hours by one. The additional five hours arise chiefly because credit is now given for lab work that previously was not acknowledged. Courses 316K, 316L, and 316M have been changed to four credit courses to give proper credit for up to six hours per week spent in lab for each course. Geology 208K is a new lab course that treats topics previously covered in 301 and 304 (or 305) when these courses had two-hour labs.

That on page 24 under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Geology" under "A. Prescribed Work," the following changes be made:

(1) Change Requirement 4

From: Physics 801, or 401 and 416.

To: Physics 302K, 302L, 102M, and 102N; or 401 and 416.

Reason: Physics 801 was restructured.

(2) Change Requirement 7

From: Twelve semester hours selected from the following:
Botany 319, upper-division botany; Chemistry 810a,
810b, 412K, 314, upper-division chemistry; Civil
Engineering 354; Engineering Mechanics 310;
Mathematics 316, 318K, 318L, upper-division
mathematics; Meterology 320K, other upper-division
meterology; Petroleum Engineering 320, other upperdivision petroleum engineering; Philosophy 329L, 363;
Physics 415, upper-division physics; Zoology 414, upperdivision zoology.

<u>To:</u> Nine semester hours selected from the following courses, at least six semester hours being selected from one of the following groups:

Group 1. Astronomy 362K, 364, Physics 415;

Group 2. Botany 319, 420, 421, 373K, Zoology 325, 336, 440, 353, Microbiology 319, 119K, Marine Science 341;

Group 3. Chemistry 810, 412K, 353, Marine Science 341;

Group 4. Mathematics 316, 427K, 427L, Computer Sciences 404G, 310;

Group 5. Chemical Engineering 354, 365K, 368,
Mechanical Engineering 320, Meterology 321,
Petroleum Engineering 311, 368, 369.
Alternative courses will be considered by
petition.

(3) Change Requirement 9

From: Forty-eight semester hours of geology, including the following courses: Geology 301 or 303, and 304 (or the equivalent courses), 316K, 316L, 316M, 320K, 321, 322K (or 314K), 328, and 660.

To: Fifty semester hours of geology, including the following courses: Geology 301 or 303 and 304 (or equivalent courses), 208K, 416K, 416L, 416M, 320K, 321, 322K, 328, 336K, and 660.

Reason: To make the requirements match revised course offerings. The changes add eight required geology hours to the degree. However, five hours arise because credit is now given for lab work that was previously not acknowledged. Courses 316K, 316L, and 316M have been changed to four credit courses to give proper credit for up to six hours per week spent in lab for each course. Geology 208K is a new lab course that treats topics previously covered in 301 and 304 (or 305) when these courses had two-hour labs. Geology 336K is the third of a series (416K, 416L, 336K) of courses in mineralogy-petrology that is essential to a professionally-oriented degree.

(4) Change Requirement 10

<u>From</u>: Enough elective courses, not in geology, to make a total of 126 semester hours.

<u>To:</u> Enough elective courses, not in geology, to make a total of 128 semester hours.

<u>Reason</u>: To adjust the total hours to match the two additional hours added to the major.

2. The University Council has endorsed, by the circularization procedure, as of October 20, 1972, certain proposals to amend the Catalogue of the College of Natural Sciences for 1973-1975, (D&P 5255-5256).

# RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY

The Department of Zoology makes the following recommendations:

That in the College of Natural Sciences catalogue for 1971-73 on page 21 under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts in Zoology" under "D. Majors," the following changes be made:

From: Eight semester hours of organic chemistry and six semester hours of calculus are required of all students majoring in zoology.

Major: (1) A minimum of nine semester hours selected from the following: Zoology 311 or 411, 325 or 425, 351 or 451, 249; (2) Zoology 332 or 353; (3) Zoology 369 or 370K; (4) enough additional hours in upper-division courses to make a total of twenty-four hours. Of these, three hours shall be in zoology (excluding 324K and 327), and the remainder may be selected from any biological science, chemistry (excluding required organic), mathematics (excluding required calculus), or physics.

To: Six hours of organic chemistry (excluding 305, 310, 410, 311, 411) and six hours of mathematics beyond Mathematics 305G (may be pass/fail) are required of all students majoring in Zoology.

Major: Thirty semester hours, including two hours of biological sciences laboratory, and (1) nine semester hours of Biology 302, 303, 304, or equivalent; (2) eighteen additional hours of upper-division zoology including one course from each of the following four areas: a) Genetics, b) Cellular and Molecular Biology, c) Organismal Biology, and d) Population and Environmental Biology. A listing of acceptable courses is available in the departmental office; (3) one three-hour upper-division elective course in the College of Natural Sciences (may be zoology). A course in physics is recommended. A student must make a grade of C or better in each course taken at The University of Texas at Austin and counted as satisfying the major requirement.

Receiving Agent will not require Performing Agent to furnish any supplies or services not presently available. Receiving Agent will pay Performing Agent at the same rates Performing Agent charges its own internal operating departments. The contract was approved by the State Board of Control on September 1, 1972.
- 3. Interagency Contract No. IAC(72-73)-901 beginning October 15, 1972 and ending August 31, 1973, between The University of Texas Nursing School (System-wide) and The University of Texas at El Paso whereby the University will perform consulting services to the physical plant staff as the Receiving Agent may consider necessary to its operation. The services to be performed would be in the form of professional guidance and engineering assistance in the operation of the physical plant and mechanical equipment located at The University of Texas Undergraduate Nursing School at El Paso, a unit of The University of Texas Nursing School (System-wide). For the services rendered under this contract, the Receiving Agent agrees to pay the Performing Agent at the same hourly rates plus 10% overhead which the Performing Agent pays its own professional and engineering physical plant staff. This contract was approved by the State Board of Control on October 10, 1972.

Interagency Contract No. IAC(72-73)-717 beginning September 1, 1972 and ending August 31, 1973, between the Texas Employment Commission and The University of Texas at El Paso whereby the University agrees to furnish courses of instruction and instructional aids to approved employees of the Texas Employment Commission. Receiving Agent may enroll up to 12 employees for the regular sessions and up to 4 employees for the summer session at a cost not to exceed \$1,752.00. This contract was approved by the State Board of Control on September 1, 1972.
