RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

CONTRACTS and GRANTS (Federal):

- l. Grant AFOSR-69-1744, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides the sum of \$19,840 for support of research entitled "Orbital Mechanics." The grant is effective for the period February 1, 1969 through January 31, 1970, and the research will be under the direction of Dr. Victor Szebehely, Professor of Aerospace Engineering.
- 2. Modification No. 3, Change Order to Contract Fl9(628)-5908, by which the Department of the Air Force, Electronic Systems Command, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, extends the period of the contract through May 31, 1969. Research in models of respiratory control of heart rate continues under the direction of Dr. B. F. Womack, Associate Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 6. Modification P001 to Contract F41609-68-C-0042, by which the Department of the Air Force, Aerospace Medical Division (AFSC), Brooks Air Force Base, Texas, changes the paying office to Finance and Accounting Officer, Fort Sam Houston, Texas 78234. The research on the development of a device to measure articulatory proficiency in English by foreign speakers continues under the direction of Dr. J. J. Villarreal, Professor of Speech and Education.
- 7. Modification No. 5 to Contract DA18-035-AMC-391(A), by which the Department of the Army, Edgewood Arsenal, Maryland, sets the final fixed overhead rates of 52% of salaries and wages for the period June 30, 1965 through August 31, 1965, and 40% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through September 30, 1966. The research on stratospheric and mesospheric analysis continues under the direction of Kenneth H. Jehn, Associate Professor of Meteorology.

The research entitled "Fundamental Studies in Electrochemistry" was conducted under direction of Dr. Allen J. Bard, Professor of Chemistry.
- 12. Contract DAAD05-69-C-0241, by which the Department of the Army, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, provides the sum of \$14,997 for the support of research entitled "Studies of Nonlinear Visco-elastic and Fiber Reinforced Materials." The contract is effective for the period February 10, 1969, through February 9, 1970, and the research will be under the direction of Dr. H. H. Calvit, Assistant Professor of Engineering Mechanics.

- 13. Contract DADA 17-69-C-9073, by which the Department of the Army, Medical Research and Development Command, Washington, D.C., provides the sum of \$19,171 for support of research entitled "Process of Modeling of Biological Waste Treatment." The contract is effective for the period February 1, 1969 through January 31, 1971, and the research will be directed by Dr. David M. Himmelblau, Professor of Chemical Engineering, and Dr. Earnest M. Gloyna, Professor of Civil Engineering.
- 14. Blanket Supplemental Agreement dated March 11, 1969, by which the Department of the Army, United States Army Electronics Command, Procurement and Production Directorate, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, establishes final overhead rates in the following contracts:

Modification No. 9 to Contract DA 28-043 AMC-00316(E) establishes an overhead rate of 13.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965, through June 30, 1966. The investigation and application of solion transducers was conducted in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

Modification No. 1 to Contract DA 28-043 AMC-02276(E) establishes an overhead rate of 13% of salaries and wages for the period May 16, 1966 through August 31, 1966. The study of dynamic adaptive data base management was conducted in the Linguistics Research Center under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and Linguistics.

Modification No. 10 to Contract DA 36-039 AMC-02162(E) establishes an overhead rate of 13% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966. The study and analysis of the problems of translation of foreign languages into English by automatic means was conducted by Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and Linguistics.

- 15. Modification No. 5 to Contract NObsr-95181, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D.C., extends the period of the contract through March 30, 1969, or until all funds shall have been expended, whichever shall first occur. Research continues in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 16. Modification No. 7 to Contract NObsr-95181, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D.C., cancels Modification No. 5 and provides for performance of work under the contract until all funds shall have been expended. Research continues in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 17. Modification No. 16, Supplemental Agreement to Contract Nonr-3579(01), by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., provides \$139,000 additional funds and establishes a fixed overhead rate of 13.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965, through August 31, 1966. The sonar studies continue in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 18. Modification No. 8, Change Order to Contract Nonr-3579(02), by which the Office of Naval Research, Department of the Navy, Washington, D.C., establishes a fixed overhead rate of 13.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through November 30, 1965. The research on solion transducers was conducted at Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

- 19. Modification No. 11, Change Order to Contract Nonr-3579(03), by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., establishes a fixed overhead rate of 13.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966. The underwater ordnance studies were conducted at Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 20. Modification No. 7, Change Order to Contract Nonr-3579(04), by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., establishes the fixed overhead rate of 13.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966. The research in physiological psychology of signal detection, both auditory and visual, continues at the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 21. Modification No. 6, Supplemental Agreement to Contract NOw 65-0256-d, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Air Systems Command, Washington, D. C., establishes a final fixed overhead rate of 13.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966. The research was conducted in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 22. Modification AA to Contract N00014-67-A-0126-0006, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D.C., revises the provisional overhead rate of the contract to 32.3% of salaries and wages for the period October 1, 1968 through August 31, 1969. The research entitled "Cognitive Abilities and Learning: The Development of a Theory of Individualized Instruction Through Computer-Based Research," continues under the direction of Dr. C. V. Bunderson, Assistant Professor of Computer Sciences and of Educational Psychology, and Director, Laboratory for Computer-Assisted Instruction.
- 23. Modification P002 to Contract N00024-68-C-1082, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., extends the period of the contract through December 31, 1969, or until all funds shall have been expended, whichever shall first occur. Research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 24. Modification P001 to Contract N00024-68-C-1112, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D.C., provides for work under the contract to continue until all funds shall have been expended and establishes the date of April 30, 1969 for submission of the "Reports Final." Research continues at Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 25. Modification P002, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N00024-68-C-1339, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D.C., increases the estimated cost of the contract by \$9,798 to a new total of \$615,000 and, in addition, funds the remaining \$360,000 to the contract. Development of riverine sonar for small boats continues at Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr. Director.
- 26. Contract N00140-69-C-0278, by which the Department of the Navy, Navy Purchasing Office, Brooklyn, New York, provides \$30,000 for studies related to range, bearing accuracy, source level, receiving sensitivity and beam patterns for sonar. The contract is effective for the period March 17, 1969 through March 16, 1970, and the research will be conducted in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

- 27. Modification No. 11 to Contract AT-(40-1)-2972, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, sets a final fixed overhead rate of 32.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966. The research in nuclear physics continues under the direction of Dr. I. Lon Morgan, Director, Center for Nuclear Studies.
- 28. Contract AT-(40-1)-3893, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, provides \$18,000 for a Traineeship Program for Graduate Students in Nuclear Engineering. The contract is effective for the period March 6, 1969, through August 31, 1970, and the program will be under the direction of Dr. Stephen Gage, Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering.
- 29. Amendments No. 4 and No. 5 to Indemnity Agreement No. E-25 between The University of Texas at Austin and the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, relative to the University's Nuclear Reactor Laboratory. These amendments have been issued to assure that the public will receive prompt financial compensation under the available indemnity and underlying financial protection for damage resulting from the hazardous properties of radioactive material or radiation. Dr. Stephen J. Gage, Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering, is the Director of the University's Nuclear Reactor Laboratory.
- 30. Grant No. 69-25, by which the General Services Administration, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$19,786 for support of "Microfilm Publication of Bexar Archives." The grant is effective for the period January 1, 1969 through October 31, 1969, and the program will be under the direction of Dr. Chester Kielman, Archivist.
- 31. Amendment No. 1 to Grant SCC-41003, by which the Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, Washington, D.C., increases provisions for international travel without increasing the grant total. The program for development of the teaching of the English language and linguistics in the United Arab Republic through the development of teaching materials and the conduct of workshops on the use of these materials continues under the direction of Dr. Joe W. Neal, Director, International Office.
- 32. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract OE 6-10-108 (010), by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D.C., increases the contract by \$820,000 to a new total of \$3,304,080, and extends the period of the contract through July 31, 1970. The research and development center for teacher education continues under the direction of Dr. Robert F. Peck, Professor of Educational Psychology.
- 33. Grant OEG-7-9-530077-0111-(010), by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$8,260 for support of research entitled "Relationship of Thought Processes to Language Responses in Disadvantaged Children." The grant is effective for the period February 1, 1969 through July 31, 1970. The research will be under the direction of Dr. Sara W. Lundsteen, Associate Professor of Curriculum and Instruction and Dr. Benjamin Fruchter, Professor of Educational Psychology.
- 34. Grant AI 08516-01, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, provides the sum of \$35,552 for support of research entitled "Chemical Basis of Sindbis Virus Variation." The grant is effective for the period January 1, 1969 through December 31, 1971, and the \$35,552 now appropriated is for the period January 1, 1969 through December 31, 1969. The research will be under the direction of Dr. Bernard P. Sagik, Associate Professor of Microbiology.

- 35. Grant AM 09143-05, by which the Department of Health,
 Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda,
 Maryland, provides the sum of \$19,991 for support of research entitled
 "Factors Limiting in vitro Protein Synthesis." The grant is effective
 for the period January 1, 1969 through December 31, 1970, and the
 \$19,991 now appropriated is for the period January 1, 1969 through
 December 31, 1969. The research will be under the direction of Dr. Boyd A.
 Hardesty, Associate Professor of Chemistry.
- 36. Grant AP00479-04, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, provides the sum of \$20,274 for support of research entitled "Dynamical Theories of Knudsen Aerosols." The grant is effective for the period February 1, 1969 through January 31, 1972, and the \$20,274 now appropriated is for the period February 1, 1969 through January 31, 1970. The program will be under the direction of Dr. James R. Brock, Associate Professor of Chemical Engineering.
- 37. Adjustment to Grant EH-69-610-C, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, reduces the grant award by \$737, which reflects the difference between estimated unobligated funds and actual balance of funds as shown on expenditures report. The authorized level of support for this budget period remains at \$27,150. The training program in environmental health continues under the direction of Dr. Earnest F. Gloyna, Professor of Civil Engineering.
- 38. Revised Grant GM 06590-10, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Bethesda, Maryland, increases the grant funds by \$5,711. - 2. Contract with Austin Catering Service, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby Austin Catering will service the patio food program sponsored by the University Commons. The contract extends from January 6, 1969, through August 31, 1969, the University to receive a commission of 5% of gross sales.
- 3. Amendment No. 2 to Interagency Contract No. (68-69)-281, with Texas Water Quality Board, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, extending the original contract from September 1, 1968, through April 15, 1969, the amount of the contract for this period not to exceed \$5,951.
- 4. Interagency Contract No. IAC (68-69)-435, with Office of the Governor of the State of Texas, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Bureau of Business Research will cooperate in an input-output study of the State of Texas. Colvin, whereby the University through its Visual Instruction Bureau will care for and service films for the Governor's Committee on Public School Education. ROSEMARY WALLING HARMON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: Mr. Darrell Boyd Harmon of Austin, Texas, has executed a Gift in Trust, giving to the University forty shares of the common stock of The Austin National Bank of Austin to form the initial corpus of a trust to be known as the Rosemary Walling Harmon Memorial Scholarship in memory of his wife. The income of this trust is to be used to provide scholarships for graduate students doing work in the field of psychophysiology or psychobiology at The University of Texas at Austin but provides that the trustees (the Board of Regents of the University of Texas System) may at their discretion grant scholarships hereunder to graduate students not doing work in the aforesaid field, or even may designate another purpose which might be more appropriate under the circumstances. Mr. Harmon plans to increase the corpus to \$15,000 by providing a \$10,000 bequest in his will. Any other contributions are to become a part of the corpus of the trust.

I recommend acceptance of the scholarship fund. I further recommend that the scholarship be administered by the Graduate School.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT: I recommend that the persons listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified for each, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Sec. 13, of Part One of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

- l. Mr. David M. Young, Jr., Professor and Director of the Computation Center, to serve as an advisory member of the AUA Board Committee on Physical Sciences and Mathematics, which committee advises the AUA Board of Trustees on matters relating to the physical sciences and mathematics division of the Argonne National Laboratory.
- 2. Mr. Patrick Richard, Assistant Professor of Physics, to act as Consultant to Columbia Scientific Research Institute in Austin, Texas.
- 3. Mr. C. Pavan, Professor of Physics, to act as Consultant to Union Carbide Corporation, Biology Division, Oak Ridge National Laboratories.
- 4. Mr. Alton Hodges, Instructor in Physical Training for Men, to assist without remuneration, in the United Cerbral Palsy Clinic of Bastrop County, helping with physical therapy of patients in that area where there is no qualified person in rehabilitation exercises.
- 5. Dr. Dana P. Copp, Physician in Student Health Center, to perform physical examinations for insurance companies in the applicant's home.
- 6. Dr. Curtis Reese, Physician in Student Health Center, to work part-time with the Mental Health-Mental Retardation Center.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council. I recommend approval:

- the recommendations of the Calendar Committee for the 1970 Summer Session (D&P 4382-83). This calendar provides for two six week terms as well as a nine and twelve week term. Registration is on June 2-3, with classes beginning Thursday, June 4. Students registering for any course on these days will register and pay fees for all other courses to be taken during the entire Summer Session. Final examinations for first term courses are July 11-14, with no classes for the nine and twelve week classes scheduled on those days. Students in attendance for the second term only register on Wednesday, July 15. Examinations for nine-week courses will be given August 1-4, Saturday-Tuesday, with examinations for second-term and twelve-week courses August 22-25. Tuesday, August 25 is Graduation day but no public exercises.
- 2. The Faculty Council on March 25, 1969, approved by the circularization procedure changes in the College of Pharmacy catalogue (D&P 4384-4387).

This legislation rearranges slightly the courses and semester hours in specified courses that are required to be accepted for admission to the sequence of professional courses (third-year), the total, however, remaining 60 semester hours. It also rewrites the section under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy, not altering, however, the 160 semester hour requirement. The legislation points out that the proposed curriculum permits the realization of several objectives which have been accepted by the faculty of the College of Pharmacy as being desirable; to-wit, (a) it provides a better arrangement of sequences within the professional curriculum; (b) it provides a greater opportunity for elections within the professional sequence as well as in general electives; and (c) it frees the last semester—except for clinical pharmacy and professional electives—so that senior students may be placed in experimental programs of a clinical nature which are being developed at several locations within the University System.
