Comments:

The University of Texas System Plan for Professional Medical Liability Self-Insurance went into effective on April 1, 1977, and is funded by the payment of premiums from the Medical Service, Research and Development Plans of the U. T. System health institutions. Actuaries from Tillinghast, Inc., reviewed the eighteen-year experience of the Plan and recommended a restructuring of the premium rates by risk class (specialty) to equitably reflect the loss experience among all Plan risk classes. Based upon the Plan's favorable experience during the last fiscal year, an expected 6.5% investment return, and the effect of tort reform legislation passed by the 74th Texas Legislature, the premium rates were adjusted to reflect an overall 12% decrease.

Salary ranges are supported by compensation data for the area concerned. These adjustments have been initiated by the various component institutions, appropriately reviewed, and have received the approval of the Office of the Chancellor.

ASHBEL SMITH PROFESSORSHIPS

The following minimum criteria for nonendowed Ashbel Smith Professorships (or Ashbel Smith type professorships) have been approved by the Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and the Executive Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs and are submitted for ratification by the U. T. Board of Regents. The minimum criteria consolidate 1993 guidelines and earlier guidelines approved by the U. T. Board of Regents in one listing.

Each recommended appointment to an Ashbel Smith Professorship or equivalent nonendowed professorship shall be approved based on criteria developed by the institution which shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 1. attainment of the rank of professor with tenure at the component institution:
- demonstration, as determined by faculty peers, of excellence in teaching and scholarship;
- earned distinction and recognition to the institution as a result of academic accomplishments; and
- 4. possession of personal characteristics that permit an appointee to serve as an example to students and faculty.

Furthermore, persons nominated for or holding such positions of distinction must comply with the following conditions:

- not hold an appointment as a member of the administration (including departmental chairmen and deans or directors) at the time of the selection and initial appointment, but persons so named who subsequently are appointed to administrative positions will not be required to relinquish the title;
- if another named or endowed professorship or chair is accepted by an incumbent, the Ashbel Smith (or equivalent) appointment will be vacated; and
- 3. the holders of such professorships may be granted emeritus status in the professorship upon retirement or upon assuming modified service and, as such, will not be counted against the authorized number of such professorships at the institution.

System Administration has administratively approved and reports for the record the following student insurance plan premium rates for fiscal year 1996-97. All plans are offered through the Student Insurance Division of United Companies, Inc. of Irving, Texas, and are underwritten by MEGA Life and Health Insurance Company.

Ratification is requested to authorize each institution to enter into an agreement with the Student Insurance Division for the provision of insurance.

The plan for 1996-97 offers increased coverage with no premium increase from 1995-96. New increased coverages include: 1) increase of maximum benefit to \$100,000; 2) increase in evacuation benefit to \$20,000; 3) a prescription drug benefit allowing for \$2.00 and \$5.00 copayments respectively for generic and brand name prescriptions dispensed at the component institutions and \$5.00 and \$10.00 copayments respectively for generic and brand name prescriptions dispensed at a network pharmacy: 4) an increase in PPO benefits to be paid at 90% for network providers; 5) an increase in out-of-network benefits to be paid at 70%; 6) no charge for pap smears including the lab work if the services are provided by the student health center; and 7) an increase in psychotherapy benefits to \$65.00 per individual session, \$20 per day for group therapy, and a maximum benefit of \$975.
