EERMINATION AGREEMENTS WITH SOUTHWESTERN EELL TELEPHONE COMPANY: The general exchange tariffs of the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company require supplemental agreements to the regular contracts for telephone service. With the opening of Kinsolving Dormitory the switchboard and telephone service at Women's Residence Halls will be enlarged, and the Division of Mousing and Food Service will move into Kinsolving. Such enlargements of facilities requires that we enter into termination agreements with the telephone company for this service. The termination agreement for the Blanton Dormitory installation requires minimum service of 60 months or a termination charge of \$3,400 reduced by 1/60th for each month service is retained. The termination agreement for the facilities in Kinsolving Dormitory requires a sum of \$500 to be paid as termination charge for less than 12 months service, to be reduced by 1/12th for each month service is retained. I recommend ratification of these agreements and that Mr. Landrum, Business Manager, be authorized to sign for the University. (1516)

WAIVER OF AGE LIMIT FOR FULL-TIME TEACHING: Elsewhere in this docket is the request for the full-time appointment of Mr. David Ogg, as Visiting Professor of English for the First Semester and of History for the Second, and of Mr. Bertram Colgrave, as Visiting Professor of English the First Semester. Mr. Ogg is 71 years of age, and Mr. Colgrave 70, and their appointment would be in violation of the Regents rule that service should be on a modified basis after 70. Both men are from Oxford University and will be in this country for only a brief season, and hence their appointments are completely temporary. Their British colleagues and the American istitutions recently acquainted with their work assure us there is no question of their complete competence to carry on effective academic instruction. Accordingly, I recommend that their appointments be approved.

WAIVER OF NEPOTISM RULE: Mr. Warren H. Adams who has been nominated as New Instructor in Romance Languages for 1958-59 is related in the first degree of affinity to Dr. Eric E. Muirhead, Professor of Pathology at No. 177 Southwestern Medical School, Dr. Adams' wife being Dr. Muirhead's sister. No. 1881.
