



CHANCELLOR The University of Texas System

The Board of Regents of The University of Texas System invites nominations, inquiries, and applications for the role of **Chancellor - The University of Texas System**.

For more than 140 years, The University of Texas System has been committed to improving the lives of Texans and people all over the world through education, health care, and research. The University of Texas System is one of the nation's largest systems of higher education, that educates more than 256,000 students and employs more than 160,000 faculty, health care professionals, researchers, support staff, and student workers as one of the largest employers in the state. UT institutions are powerful drivers of economic and social mobility in Texas, producing more than 66,000 graduates annually, including more than one-third of the state's undergraduate degrees and about 63% of the state's medical degrees. The U.T. System has an annual operating budget of \$30.9 billion.

As the Chief Executive Officer of the System, the Chancellor reports directly to the Board of Regents and is responsible for executing the policies of the Board. The Chancellor provides administrative leadership to U.T. System Administration and to the Presidents of the System's nine academic institutions (Arlington, Austin, Dallas, El Paso, Permian Basin, Rio Grande Valley, San Antonio, Stephen F. Austin, and Tyler) and five health institutions (Southwestern Medical Center, Medical Branch at Galveston, Health Science Center at Houston, Health Science Center at San Antonio, and M.D. Anderson Cancer Center at Houston).

The U.T. System's faculty members, researchers, and clinicians are consistently honored by their peers, professional associations and academies, and other organizations for contributions to their fields. Honors and distinctions among the System's internationally distinguished faculty include: 5 Nobel laureates, 2 Shaw laureates, 56 members of the National Academy of Sciences, 53 members of the National Academy of Engineering, 62 members of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, 24 members of the American Law Institute, 86 members of the American Academy of Nursing, and 4 members of the National Academy of Medicine. In addition, U. T. System health professions provide care to millions of patients each year, and U. T. System faculty and students are engaged in cutting-edge research and are making significant discoveries that benefit society.

The U.T. System seeks an individual with unquestioned integrity, high energy and demonstrated leadership and administrative abilities, capable of leading one of the finest and most prominent public university systems in America and the world. The ideal candidate will present a record of significant executive leadership and accomplishments; will have a record of working effectively with state and national legislative bodies; and will understand and appreciate the culture of the U.T. System. The Chancellor will continue U.T. System's distinctive tradition of excellence as an internationally prominent, student-centered university system.

Reporting directly to the Chancellor are Executive Vice Chancellors for Academic Affairs, Business Affairs, and Health Affairs; Vice Chancellor and General Counsel; Vice Chancellor Governmental Relations; Vice Chancellors for External Relations; and all Academic and Health Institution Presidents.

Through the leadership of the Chancellor, Board of Regents, and U.T. Presidents, student success and access are top priorities for The University of Texas System, and it is expected that the next Chancellor will lead U.T. institutions in continuing to set the standard for excellence in higher education.
