





- UT Austin Dell Medical School and UT Rio Grande Valley School of Medicine began enrolling students in fall 2016.



Average Total Academic Cost represents the sum of all statutory, designated (including differential tuition), and board-authorized tuition, along with mandatory fees (including college and course fees). It is derived from actual fee bills for resident undergraduate students enrolled in 15 semester credit hours in the fall and spring semesters.

Average Net Academic Cost for all full-time students is derived by subtracting the total need-based grant aid from the total academic costs of all students and then dividing by the total number of students.

As an example: Of all full-time resident undergraduates at UT Arlington, 49.5% received at least one dollar in need-based grant and scholarship aid. On average, this aid covered 71.5% of total academic costs for this subgroup.




4-Year Graduation Rates

2017 First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking (FTFTDS) Fall Cohort






6-Year Graduation Rates

2015 First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking (FTFTDS) Cohort







STEM + Health Degrees as a Percent of Total Degrees Awarded, 2020







When students take out student loans, they are investing in their future. It is important to view loan debt in context with what the future return on investment (ROI) will be. One way to gauge ROI is through earnings outcomes from post-graduation employment (highlights on the next two pages).

The average loan debt for UT baccalaureates in the most recent graduating cohort was \$20,788.

For all Texas public universities, the average was \$24,301. The national average for public universities was \$27,539.






Non-Faculty Employees by Type and by Gender and Race/Ethnicity









An additional metric of patient care: UT physician practices provided care to 2,727,469 **unique patients** in FY 2021. The number of unique patients represents the number of unique medical records with at least one active visit within the year. According to Fitch Ratings, the significance is that this measures the number of unique patients accessing—as well as remaining in—the healthcare organization. This is an indicator of access, demand, and market presence.

For FY 2021, 43.7% of UT System revenues comes from hospital, clinic, and professional fees related to patient care.

Hospitals and clinics account for **35.0%** of total expenses.
